NEW GIULIA SPIDER

Alfa revealed a new Giulia Spider at the recent Geneva Car Show. The model is basically a mild 1600 Veloce with the torque curve shifted towards the lower rpms. There are several refinements to the new car. The most obvious is the new body styled by Pininfarina. The car uses a grill similar to the traditional Alfa grills, has flared type headlights (although the flarings are illegal in (alifornia), vent windows that open and close, sunvisors, sculptured sides, a new dashboard with new instruments, and a larger trunk.

The engine is reputed to put out 125 SAE hp, have a top speed over 113 mph, and give over 26 mpg. The selling price in the U.S. will be in the \$3300 range.



LET'S GET TECHNICAL by Barry Thompson

## Fitting of Main and Rod Bearings

When assembling the lower end of an engine it is critical to have the proper clearance between the bearing shell and the crankshaft. Too little clearance means excessive friction and insufficient lubrication. This leads to overheating and excessive wear on the bearing until the bearing fails. The bearing siezes to the crank! If you're lucky the bearing shell spins inside the housing ruining a connecting rod or main bearing housing. If your unlucky, the shell doesn't rotate and the connecting rod breaks, fly cutting the block in half. That's really expensive!

On the other hand excessive clearance must also be avoided. In this case the crankshaft is not rigidly supported and vibrates inside the bearings, again causing excessive friction and wear. Also, too much oil will flow through the bearing damaging the bearing and bleeding the oil pressure, causing insufficient lubrication in the remainder of the engine.

In general, bearing shells are made to very close tolerances, but the shells can be off size or the crankshaft off size. The best way to check bearing clearances is to use Plastigage made by Perfect Circle, available in all good parts houses. Plastigage is a soft plastic thread. It is placed between the bearing shell and crankshaft, and the bearing cap is torqued to the specified amount. The only precautions necessary are to keep the crankshaft from turning and to keep the weight of the crankshaft from flattening the Plastigage. Preferably the crankshaft should not rest on the bearing shell, but if it must, it should be well supported by the other bearings. The cap and shell are then removed and the Plastigage is observed to be flattened into a ribbon. The width of the ribbon is indicative of the bearing clearance, and is measured with the supplied guage. It's so simple you'll wonder why you didn't think of the idea and make millions of dollars selling it!

The proper clearance for Alfa bearings are 0.0005 to 0.002 inches range. The larger clearances are preferred for racing while the smaller ones are best for street use.

SLALOM TEAM

At the end of two championships our slalom team consisting of John McGarry and Alan Ward in Class F, George Eickhoff and Fritz Taggart in Class H, and Phyllis Gaylard in Class FW, was officially tied for first place. In the second championship our team earned 471.6 points. The next closest team scored only 400.4 points. Due to a change in the scoring method for women's team points, Phyllis has been replaced by Dan Newton in Class F. Unofficially our team took first place in the third championship, and has now moved into first place. RAH-rah team!






