LET'S GET TECHNICAL By Gary Boehm

Are you wasting maney by buying premium or "hi-test" gasoline? A popular misconception is that the extra 3 to 6 cents a gallon you pay for premium is buying a gasoline with more "zip". Actually, regular gasoline will give you just as much power if your engine can run properly on it, so let's discuss what determines the gasoline you need.

The reason for multiple grades of gasoline can be found in the cylinders of your engine. After the gas-air mixture is drawn into the cylinder it is compressed by the piston and them ignited by the spark plug, resulting in a rapid pressure rise which pushes the piston down and generates your power. However, if the engine has a high compression ratio, when the spark plug fires what occurs is not a rapid burning of the mixture but a minor explosion! This is the "pinging" which you may have heard on occasion, and it's hard on the engine.

The addition of "anti-knock" compounds can prevent this pinging, and this is what you buy with your extra money, so there's no need to pay for more anti-knock than your particular engine needs. As a general rule of thunb: below 8:1 compression "regular" gas is satisfactory, between 8:1 and 10:1 "mid-ethyl" should be used, and above 10:1 "premium" is required. However, engine-to-engine and brand-to-brand variations can sometimes invalidate these guidelines, so the best

guide is to test your car. If your car will operate without pinging under load-such as climbing a hill with wide open throttle--the gas you are using is adequate, so don't pay for a more expensive grade.
