

ALFA WIST

Four days before the weekend of Alfa Expo West, a dozen dedicated members sat gloomily around the coffee table in Paula Taggart's living room. Vince Giobbe, in a tone suggestive of impending doom, recommended Mexico City. It was the final pre-event meeting of the Expo Committee. After hearing Kalo Piequet's report on pre-registration, we were all looking a bit paled. Dale Jones had hastily slashed the estimate of rooms required at the Royal Coach Inn, and was making plans for a last minute retreat on the Banquet guarantee.

Our first meeting had been in September of 1970- we met monthly at first, weekly (weakly?) toward the end- and I wondered if all that work could really produce a monumental flop. Well, Alfa Expo West was many things, but a flop it was not. Friday night at the Royal Coach Inn really turned things on, as Alfa owners from Washington to Connecticut, Texas to Illinois shared stories (and harder stuff) 'till the wee morning hours.

Seventy four members showed up to make nearly two hundred runs (over two minutes per run) on the time trial course at OMS. 28 entered the drags. Everything was a success...130 showed up at the banquet/meeting that evening (cont. P.12)

Watkins Glen: ALFA Puts Finishing Touch on Porsche, Ferrari

WATKINS GLEN, July 25 An underpowered Alfa 33/3, like the
proverbial faithful mail truck,
made its rounds through rain and
wind to deliver Alfa Romeo its
victory letters in the final race
of the 1971 World Manufacturer's
Championship. Andrea de Adamich
and Ronnie Peterson added insult to
injury as they denied the 5-liter
cars a win in their last
appearance. Next year's
Championship series will see the
start of a 3-liter limit, and we
can already see the gleams and
smirks coming from Milan.

The '71 season turned out to be an amazingly successful one for Alfa with its 3-liter 33's capturing (appropriately) three firsts, three seconds and three thirds in the eleven race series, finishing second overall with 57 points to Porsche's 85. Ferrari, third with 26 points, went winless for the season.

Alfa brought two new cars to the Glen - an all new lighter weight tube frame "33/3TT" (Telaio Tubolare) and a 33/4 - a 4-liter engine in the standard 33 chassis. Neither car saw action, however, as the TT crashed in practice and the 4-liter engine was pulled to make the car available for Saturday's race as a 33/3. DeAdamich also drove in Sunday's CanAm, moving his 33/3 (the same car he won Saturday's race in) up from 15th on the starting grid to a 7th place finish. A special Porsche 917/10 STP CanAm car finished third.

Trans Am

With only three races to go in the season, Alfa has a good lead with

51 points to Datsun's 39, but also has a close eye on the rear view mirror. John Morton has brought Pete Brock's BRE Datsun 510 home first in the last two meets - and Horst Kwech's 1750 is the only Alfa that can even stay close. Our own Lee Midgely finished second in the last race - scant inches ahead of Kwech. It seems that Lee finally decided to stop for fuel - not realizing he was on the last lap about to get the checker - and had to race through the pit lane to get it. Lee, running a Shankle 1600 engine, was one of the only two cars not to stop for gas. Vic Provenzano finished fourth driving in his usual fine style.

Alfa Debuts New 2000

You thought the trusty little 4-banger was finally stretched to it's limit in the 1750, right? Wrong. Alfa has shown 2-liter versions of the Spider, GTV, and Berlina - all with an advertised 150 hp. The GTV and Spider will have a limited slip as standard equipment (optional in the Berlina). The Berlina will also have optional factory air conditioning. When will a 2000 appear on this side of the Atlantic? Surely you jest!



It took a lot of work from a lot of people to make it a successful weekend, but the obvious enjoyment of everyone there made it all worthwhile


