



AROSC-WILLOW SPRINGS TIME TRIALS NOVEMBER 18TH

Come on out and join all your fellow ALFA freaks on Saturday, November 18th, for a day of enjoyment at Willew Springs Raceway. Willew is located off Highway 14, north of Lancaster. It is a very interesting 9-turn, 2.5 mile course.

Practice runs will consist of 10 to 15 minutes of uninterrupted driving on course for each run. Timed runs will consist of two laps per run.

There will be a MANDATORY drivings meeting at 8:00 a.m. If you are not on time, you will be disqualified, with forfeiture of entry fee.

All open cars must have rell bars.

Complete information will be available at the next AROSC meeting, on October 20th.

COME DRIVE WITH US

WHAT: A "low pressure" time trial event There will be 4 hours of practice runs and 4 hours of timed runs. Each practice "run" will actually consist of 10-15 minutes of uninterrupted driving on course.

WHEN: Saturday, November 18, 1972 WHERE: Willow Springs Raceway in Rosamond, approx. 75 miles north of L.A. Civic Center. Take the Antelope Valley Freeway, then go west on Rosamond Blvd. The track will be on your right side, about 9 miles after turning onto Rosamond Blvd.

COURSE: 2.5 miles, 9 turns, 0.5 mile main straight. No pylons will be used on the course -- this is not a slalom event.

EQUIPMENT: Bring a helmet if at all possible -- a limited number of loaners will be available at the track. No air, water or gas will be available at the track--nearest gas station 9 miles from track.

ENTRY: Entry fee is \$15. Pre-entry only, limited to a maximum of 36 entries. All cars must be Alfas or Alfa powered. All entries must be received by October 15, 1972. If you are not going to compete, but would like to participate as a course worker, call Jim Newman: (213) 481-3225 off.

(213)374-3929 home CLASSES: A - 1600 GTV, Duetto & Spider Veloce. All 4 door models. B - 1750 & 2000 GTV & Spider.

C - GTZ & GTA

D - all 1300 cc models.

S - All SCCA race prepared cars, specials, and any .: other not falling in any of the above categories.

Each class will have 3 subgroups, as follows:

1 - Showroom stock--Mag wheels are permitted, but tires must be street tires of same size as original factory equipment.

2 - SCCSCC stock--preparation not to exceed that for stock category cars as per SCCSCC Slalom Code, 1972 - edition.

3 - Prodified -- preparation not to exceed that for prodified category cars as per SCCSCC Slalom Code, 1972 edition.

Example: If you drive a 2000 GTV with mag wheels, but ab-solutely stock in all other respects, you would run in class Bl.

SCHEDULE: 7:00 am - gates open 7:30-9:00 - safety inspection All cars must have proper seat belts (stock belts ok), all open cars must have rollbars.


8:00 - MANDATORY driver's and workers meeting. Any entrant not on time for this meeting will be disqualified.

8:30-12:30 - practice runs 12:30-1:00 - lunch--no food available at track--NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE RACE_ WAY GROUNDS.

1:00-5:00 - timed runs 5:00 - trophy presentation-trophies will be provided


