Time Trial #5

Unfortunately Rolf couldn't make it, but the Boy Scouts of America did. It seems that they had set up a meeting in the infield next to the esses. I took my Ferrari out on the track and screamed down to Turn 2 through the early morning fog. As I rounded Turn 2, I was alarmed to find the whole length of the esses strewn with broken beer bottles. had no competitors in Class E and was moved to Class D which he won. Wally has been driving constantly for two years now and has become a very good driver. His time of 2:25.45 is a new class-lap record breaking the one Alan Ward set in April, 1976 by a second. Rich Washington missed breaking the Class F lap record by . 13 seconds and won his class for a second time. First time novice Mike Speery got second place with his Alfetta. Mike is very entertaining to watch drive as he is constantly seeing by how much he can exceed the limits of adhesion. Charlie Teale edged out Dan Bernstein by a very close . 07 sec. margin. Raul Perez moved up to Class F and went over seven seconds faster than in June. Swain Williams gave himself a scare when his tire went flat and he spun out in Turn 2. Next time I think Swain will remember to raise his tire pressures before running the car on the track. Fred Zimmerman brought his pretty 1600 Sprint up from San Diego to (cont pg 5)


