RALLYE SURVEY RESULTS AND THE 1979 SEASON

The most interesting fact discovered by the Rallye Survey that ran in the August and September issues of Alfacionada, is that most of you don't respond to surveys. Of the almost eleven responses I received, one third were seasoned veterans, one third had modest experience, and one third were novices. And that is about the same breakdown for those who entered the October Rallye. However, the winner had no previous experience.

And that is the big lesson. don't need er grience to enjoy a Rallye, and a cording to the "old Rallye, and a cording to the timers who took part in the October run, it doesn't have to require on-board computers to be fun. As Director of Rallyes, I would like five of you to step forward and work with me to organize the It won't 1979 Rallye Program. require a large amount of time, and it doesn't mean you can't run in the Rallyes. Serving on the Rallye Committee means that one of us must be present at each event, to certify that the Competition Code is followed, and that the winners are properly recorded with the AROSC Competition Director for year-end awards.

Serving on the Rallye Committee means getting together for a review and refinement of the Rallye Competition Code, which is now in Rough Draft form. Serving on the Rallye Committee means creating a momentum that you'll be able to draft in for years to come.

For the 1979 Season, I propose:

1. A total of five Rallyes. 2. A total of two Grand Tours,

(more about them later). 3. That the level of difficulty be accelerated with each successive Rallye, so that novices are encouraged in the beginning, and seasoned, giving tham a competitive chance against the more experienced drivers and navigators.

4. That a uniform code of scoring be developed for use in all rallyes; one that recognizes the individual and team results. (Most survey responses favored team scoring).

I propose that the AROSC Rallyes be written to test our skills and not our pocket books; that the road be the challenge, and not the cost of

special equipment.

6. I propose that Grand Tours be non-competitive events, designed for the pure motoring pleasure of any and all club members.

These are all proposals, simple words on paper. They can be improved upon, expanded, made more concise, if five of you will take the time to give me some feed-back. But they can be nothing more than words on paper unless you also give me a little bit of yourselves.

To kick off the 1979 Season, Alana and I will write a Grand Tour. An all-day affair, fair weather or foul with lunch scheduled in the San Marcos Pass just North of Santa Barbara. We're just starting it, so we can't give you specifics, (the date will be announced after consultation with the Board of Directors) but itewill be a freeway-free ride through winter green rolling hills and misty pastures of horses. With a little help, we might make it semi-instructional and have a few Rallye classes at a rest stop or two. But more than that, it's just for the fun of the drive. Grand Touring, a drive on roads that show you what every gear can do, rest stops where the Tour regroups and stretches their legs, or enjoys a view, buys some fresh honey from a farmer, or breaks open the thermos of hot chocolate. Sounds and smells that bring nostalgia to some and


