

YOUR ALFA IGNITION SYSTEM AND YOU by Dan Bernstein

The conventional ignition system, essentially unchanged since its invention in 1914, is simple. It consists of a set of breaker points timed to interrupt electric current in the ignition coil in exact synchronism with the travel of the pistons. When the points open, the interruption of current induces a high voltage in the coil which is applied to the spark plug. The ensuing spark explodes the gas in the cylinder and the piston is started on another revolution. It's all very straightforward..... and it works (almost always). How well it works, or doesn't, depends on the amount of energy stored in the coil while the points are closed, and how much of this energy is available for generating a spark when the points are opened. Using some measurements I made on the coil in my GTV, I computed the energy stored in the coil for nominal dwell angle as a function of engine RPM, and during cranking. From the chart, it can be seen that during cranking and at 7000 RPM, (who runs at 7 grand?...come to the next time trial and see) energy stored in the coil is 55% and 33%, respectively, of the low RPM maximum. This is a weakness of the conventional ignition system. Another weakness, the relatively low rise time of the high voltage applied to the spark plug, limits the amount of energy stored in the coil which can be used to generate a spark. Until the voltage at the spark plug rises to the ionizing potential of the gas in the cylinder so as to produce a spark, power losses, due to fouled plugs and point and distributor arcing, take place. Since Power x Time = Energy, slow rise time results in energy loss.



The capacitive discharge ignition system eliminates these weaknesses of the conventional ignition system in addition to reducing ignition system maintainance.

Road and Track magazine printed two excellent articles on CD systems (Sept. & Nov. 1972), so I won't go into all the specifics. All CD systems deliver a constant amplitude, fast rise time, and a high voltage pulse to the spark plug, which minimizes hard starting and high RPM miss.

With the exception of better starting, particularly with late model Alfas, a CD system offers no significant performance advantages over the conventional system, provided that the car is in a good state of tune. A good state of tune is more than points and plugs every now and then. If you don't know what is involved, rely on your dealer or service shop. If you are not inclined to be all that diligent in caring for your Alfa, a CD system will allow you to maintain an acceptable level of performance with a significant reduction in ignition system maintainance.



The letter to the other clubs, along with copies of other correspondence will be available for your examination at the General Membership meeting in May.
