

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS of the CAR KIND

Every August Northern California is visited by an unique horde of extra-territorial beings who are drawn to a particular valley settled among the hills of Monterey on an Army base. From 1915 Ford Run-Abouts to a 1973 512M Ferrari, a whole congenial conglomerate of interesting automobiles converge for a weekend of fun and races at Laguna Seca. For me it has become an annual happening - something to plan a year ahead.

Two AROSC members entered their cars this year. Dave with his GTA (a first time entrant himself and the debut of an Alfa GTA in these particular races) and Jack Becronis in his fantastic 1928 1500 Zagato bodied Spyder (a first time entrant also). Thanks to Steve Earle, the coordinator for the whole event, we first-timers soon learned the ropes and were able to concentrate on the enjoyment of the meet.

This Fifth Annual Monterey Historic Races was a salute to Mercedes Benz. Well, Mercedes just happened to ship over the famous 300 SLR for the event! This car, never seen in the United States, was the focal point of the race weekend. Not only was it on display, but Phil Hill was its driver! Suddenly a great silence would pervade the crowd - Phil Hill had jumped into the German monster machine and begun to scream it around the track. The only music to be heard was the sound of the car being wound up through the gears at 7500 or 8000 RPMs by a true master. The changing chords reverberated through all who stood nearby - a sound one won't forget, a sight one probably will never see again!

Then it was time for our races. Phil Hill also drove Jack's car! How exciting it must be to see one's car being driven by a World Champion! However, the Spyder developed an intermittent miss at high rpm's and the master had to bring the car in after a few laps. The problem was easily diagnosed as a clogged carburetor main jet, the symptom being purely, as Phil Hill put it, "...a diabolical miss"! Simple blowing out set things right but the eight lap race was already run.

I was waiting for Dave's race to begin. After practise in the morning, Dave and his chief mechanical crew, Dick Gebhardt and Tom Hines, had replaced the head gasket in record time. I couldn't help but wonder how they had felt with so many people looking on, one of which the least was Phil Hill! Now the time had come to race!

There were lots of Alfas and Ferraris, a few Aston Martins in his race, plus a very fast Porsche Carrera. The grid placement must have been decided on an interest basis for the Alfas seemed to be placed at slight disadvantages. Marnix Dillenius in his TZ was set at 7th and Dave in his GTA was set at 13th. But the Alfas didn't let their fans down even though eight laps do not give one much time to move up! And the Alfas did prove the legend of excellent handling, much to others' dismay!
