THE GAMBLING ROUTE

DAY I Plan on leaving your home so you reach Lancaster between 6 and 7 am. For speed I recommend traveling on I-5 to 14. Early in the morning the small towns are just waking up, and there are no traffic problems to worry about. Later the ride along 395 can be hot, but in the ~~morning~~ this is a nice ride. You will pass thru the cities of Lone Pine, and Bishop, good places for gas or cold drinks, or stop by Mono lake for a picnic. You will approach the mountains, by late morning, and will have to look for straight pavement to pass all of those overheating motor homes. One city you might want to stop in is Carson city, it has a nice museum to tour and is located on the main road thru town. Then it is on to Reno, for a nice meal and a little gambling.

DAY II Start off the day with one of those cheap breakfasts this town is famous for. Then spend the morning touring the Harrahs car collection in Sparks. A must see no matter how many times you've been there. After looking at cars hop into yours and head for Route 80, turn off at 89 and spend some relaxing time driving thru Lassen park. If you are into camping there are many good sites along the road, or if motels are your idea of roughing it, plan on spending the night on I-5 between Weed and Yreka. If you drive past MT. Shasta at dusk you will be seeing something worth the trip.

DAY III The rest of this trip is easy, just follow I-5 to Seattle.

THE SEA BREEZE ROUTE

DAY I This route really starts from San Francisco. We like to take I-5 (save the coast route for Laguna Seca in August) not much to see, but arriving early gives us time for a short SF stay.

DAY II Now comes the fun part, take 101 out of SF and do a little serious wine tasting. Do worry about getting a book on locations, they are along the roads.

DAY III Get off the freeway and drive thru the redwoods, the ride is cool and shops that sell redwood are abundant, also take a short hike along one of the paths found at the road side. When you get tired of craning your neck to see the tops of those giants, continue on Northward to the Oregon coast. (remember it is against the law to pump your own gas) Again there are some beautiful camp grounds, just try to camp early, around 3pm, to assure yourselves a spot. Coos Bay has some nice motels, and all the little coastal cities are geared up for tourists. You are now in the land of Myrtle wood, a very rare wood, and the different shops do alot of things with it.

DAY IV Continue up the coast, stop off at the sea lion caves for a bumper sticker. Also stop by Tillamook for a free cheese sample and take a peek at how that famous cheese is made. Next you can stay at Sea Side a little popular resort town or cont. on over the Astoria bridge (toll) to Wash. I personally spent many a summer in this area so it is a favorite of mine. If you are a salmon fisherman, I suggest you spend the day at Ilwaco, to do some of the best ocean fishing.

DAY V Continue up 101 and take the short cut to Montesano, from there you drive up on 12 to I-5 just below Olympia. (If you go right instead, take the next exit for a tour of the Olympia brewery) Then it is just about an 1 1/2 hour drive to Seattle.

We hope that you enjoy your trip to the Pacific Northwest and plan on spending a few days touring this area. Next month we will give you some hints of places to go, things to see and places to eat while staying in Seattle. Hope to see you all there.
