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### TECHNICAL TIPS

#### HEATER VALVE REPLACEMENT

After a hot run at the May autocross, my right foot felt a little warm. I would've liked to believe it had something to do with my competitive driving skill. But, unfortunately, my soaked, green Nike belied the true circumstances. My heater valve had falled and leaked Prestone all over my foot. As I was to quickly learn, there is an easy emergency fix to get you home or back on the track until a proper repair can be accomplished. Both the fix and the repair are relatively easy tasks.

The emergency fix (courtesy of Don Silver) can be accomplished simply by bypassing the heater. The only tools needed are a screwdriver and a knife or shears sharp enough to cut the heater hosing. Just follow these steps:

- Disconnect the heater inlet hose from the rear of the manifold directly above the intake horns. Save the clamp.
- 2. Next, if you have a C-clamp or helper with a pair of pliers, clamp the heater outlet hose that leads to the water pump. This will minimize the loss of coolant during the next step. If you have neither luxury, just move quickly.
- 3. Sever the heater outlet hose about 3  $5^{\rm m}$  from the firewall and connect the end running from the water pump to the manifold firting from which you disconnected the inlet hose in step 1.
- 4. Fix the clamp on the new connection and you can drive home.

Obviously, this procedure damages the heater outlet hose. Functionally, this can be remedied later when you reconnect the heater by simply splicing the severed hose with 3/8" copper tubing and two hose clamps. Alternatively, you can replace the whole hose or, during the emergency repair, you can disconnect it from the heater core in the passenger compartment. However, since the hose is full of coolant, be prepared to catch the drippings.

Now for the real repair. First, it's important to note your heater valve may not be at fault. It may simply be the gasket. However, since the repair procedure requires some contortionist acts under the dash, it may be simpler to replace both the valve and the gasket at once to avoid having to do it twice.

### RALLYE!







BLURB .. BLURB: Our final concours for 1984 will be held at the Briggs Cunningham Automotive Museum in Costa Mesa. If you have never visited it before, plan on allowing some time to tour the museum (between bouts of admiring the Alfas in the parking lot) - it contains some of the rarest and most valuable cars in the world. Bring a picnic lunch, as we will have use of the museum's private picnic area.

This concours is also unique in another way - for the first time ever, we will have a special class for people who have never competed in a concours before. Clean up that trusty old everyday Alfa, bring it along and see how it stacks up against it's sisters! If you are entering for the first time, just check the box on the entry form and I'll put you in the novice class. Cars are scored on a basic 200 point plus bonus system, with points allocated as follows:

Exterior: Condition - 50 Cleanliness - 15 Authenticity - 15

Interior and trunk: Condition - 24 Cleanliness - 8 Authenticity - 8 Chassis: Condition Cleanliness - 5 Authenticity - 5

Engine: Condition - 24 Cleanliness - 8 Authenticity - 8

Operational functions: Engine start/run - 3 Lights, horn ,etc - 7 Bonus points: Functional extras - 5 max (see note below)

Age (1 point/year) - 25 max

Note: Functional extras are items such as fire extinguisher, first aid kit, tool kit, emergency warning flares, owner manual, etc.

Even though the repair may cause some slight discomfort, it is not as difficult as it first appears when you gaze under the dashboard.

- 1. Drain the coolant with the heater valve open.
- 2. Remove the defroster duct (driver side) using a 7mm wrench.
- 3. Loosen the clamp on the inlet hose.
- 4. Remove the nuts holding the valve in place with a 10mm wrench. Pull the valve off the studs.
- 5. Now you have a choice. Either (a) loosen the set screw attaching the actuator cable to the lever arm on the valve (7mm) or (b) take the lever arm off the valve (8mm). I chose (b) because I didn't have the 7mm wrench.
- 6. Pull valve off of the hose.
- Remove the old gasket from the studs on the heater core. It's probably hard and brittle, thus one source of leakage.

Reassembly with a new valve and gasket is accomplished by reversing the procedure. The following hints may be useful:

- 1. It may be a good time to replace the inlet hose. The original is molded and expensive, so replacement with a universal hose may be less expensive. Your choice.
- 2. When reattaching the lever arm to the valve or fixing the set screw, be careful to do it at the <u>full closed</u> position. The lever action is longer than the cable travel, so it's easy to get it misadjusted. My first attempt yielded settings of hot and hotter.
- 3. When replacing the heater outlet hose, a little vaseline on the inside of the hose and on the heater core pipe will aid feeding the hose onto the pipe. Otherwise, you may be all day remember the contortionist positions.

Now simply replenish the antifreeze and enjoy your heater again. Until the next time your foot gets hot, green, or both.

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
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### MEETING
