


ALFAS GO



ALFA OF SANTA MONICA TIME TRIAL October 26, 1985

Our last time trial of 1985 was a huge success, and dispelled any thoughts of discontinuing our program for lack of interest. The entry list snowballed to more than 70 time trial drivers and more than 50 Special Intro drivers. It was like the Alpha Beta supermarket commercial, "Tell a Friend", as people called day and night to say they had just heard of the event and wanted to come. About 15 more came unannounced to the event. We have never had such a large turnout in our 12 years of time trials. Our previous record was 50+ at a national Alfa Club meet, with no Special Intro, all pre-registered and pre-teched cars and hired workers.

As a result of our overwhelming we were somewhat turnout, disorganized at registration, and in organizing workers and timed run groups. Thanks to all for bearing with us. We did manage to finish the runs before the sun dissappeared, although it wasn't very bright for the last group. We did need a flashlight to finish collating the times. There was some uncertainty regarding some car numbers and drivers. We think we have it sorted out, but if you see an error in the result sheet, please let me know. A number of cars did not run for time, and several others had numbers not listed anywhere. We also had confusion with two drivers in a car, as to which drove when.

I want to thank all who came to Riverside, and especially Tom Cahlane and his staff at Sun Int'l who brought out the R-5 Turbo contingent, and their friends. We hope you all had a good time, and will come again to the AROSC Time Trials. We'll notify you of our next year's program when it is set. Thanks also for a safe event -- we didn't have enough schedule slack to allow for problems with bent cars. I caught one heart-stopping incident as Gary Peterson came out of turn 9 on the fast line next to the wall, and made an abrupt right turn into the pit lane. I was about to yell at him about unsafe manuevers when I noticed that his right front tire was dead flat, and Gary wa getting out of the car rathe The tire went down shakily. and he was lucky to instantly, hang on. He didn't think he would do very well on three race tires, so he borrowed a set of street tires from Leonard Jensen's RX-7, and went on to win the class and beat Leonard.

Other noted quick cars were Mike Sperry's GTZ, as usual, Alan Ward in my GTV (which I didn't get to run - he told me the fuel pressure was off), Bill Pringle's Berlina, Neil Fedderson in Rob Tweed's R-5T2 (thanks for the demo ride), Philip deLespinay's 911S, Kevin Foye's nose-less Camaro, and Larry Vollum's Peugeot 205 Turbo, which looked almost like an R-5 Turbo. Another surprisingly fast car w Bob Henninger's Chevy Malibu. told me he would surprise some people, and he was right, as he beat most of the Alfa contingent.
