
The Formula Alfa Romeo is being imported by Mr. Aldo Caretti of the Italia Racing Team with the intention of forming a class of racing similar to Formula Ford in which all the cars are to be as matched as possible with strict rule enforcement. In this way costs will be reduced. Mr. Caretti will import all the parts as well as complete engines which may be leased or obtained on an exchange basis. The program has the backing of Alfa Romeo and Pirelli.

The engines are 1750 Boxer (horizontally opposed) 4-cylinder producing about 135 hp. The gearbox is a five-speed Hewland. The chassis is steel with aluminum honeycomb panels. The first shipment of cars is on the boat now and Mr. Caretti hopes to have one on display at our next Time Trial.

Scot Keller, ARI's Southern California District Sales Manager, waxed eloquently about their highest U.S. sales total ever (8200 in '86) and the automatic and Green Quadrifoglio Milanos coming this year. In addition to 4 Alfa Romeo picnic sets, he brought 100 25" X 41" posters showing 36 U.S. and European coupes, sedans and spiders from the Fifties to the present. MOLTO GRAZIE, ARI!!!

Congratulations to Rex Chalmers Tom Stoner for their Time Trial and Conours championships. After refreshments, the Concours and Tech Clinic video by Pete Valenzuela was a smash hit with the crowd of 150. Attending their first AROSC event were Larry Hoey, sales rep from Stadium Alfa in Anaheim and new members Deborah Ferry and Kerrie Peterson. The donations for the raffle were overwhelming: a Fusi book (THE Alfa bible), a floor jack, Time Trial and Concours entries, Alfa models, ash trays and prints, etc. and etc. Diro Alfa, Wegge Motor Cars, and Ward and Dean Racing received plaques from AROSC for their support in putting on the Clinics last year. The exciting Time Trial video with footage from Skip Farnsworth and Henry Manney rounded out the evening. Many

thanks are due to John Green and Charlie Thieriot for the many hours they spent in editing all these videos. They'd make a worthy addition to the Laguna Seca tape I bought in '85.

Our seven event '87 Time Trial season kicked off with the Entre Computer Center Time Trial on January 24th and 25th at Willow Springs. Sixty Novice and Licensed Time Trialers and 18 Special Intro speed demons had two days of thrills. Happily, the weather was sunny both days with only Saturday bringing chilling winds. Two new members came: Ron Avery drove up in his new '86 GTV/6 to compete and Bill Villasenor was there to get some tips from Mike Sperry on setting up his cylinder head. Congratulations to Harold "Hot Shoe" Rich and Bill "The Wild Man" Pringle on setting new AROSC Willow Springs lap records in Classes D and E. Mike Sperry's Ginetta won Top Time of The Day. I always enjoy seeing how far past 5000 rpm in 5th I can get while climbing the three canyon passes on the Apple Valley Freeway. It's more than exciting watching the tach rise and looking out for the CHP; it's that classic Italian tune up.

The LOS ANGELES TIMES reported on December 30th that the CHP is out to catch speeding truck and bus drivers on Interstates 5 and 10 in the L.A. and San Bernardino areas. Their game plan is to use TWO DOOR and four door unmarked patrol cars painted red, blue, green and other non-traditional colors. These cars will not have visible shotgun mounts nor roof and rear shelf lights. An 18" CHP shield will be on the doors. The CHP claims "they won't be enforcing trafficlaws selectively, but won't ignore somebody speeding by them at 100 mph." Caveat Alfa.

ARI's six variations of the Milano and Spider had a prominent position next to the Pontiac and Toyota displays at the Los Angeles Auto Show at the Convention Center January 3-II. Scot Keller, ARI's new Western Sales Manager, warmly greeted the AROSC contingent: John Green, myself, Bill Pringle, Harold Rich

and Charlie Thieriot. The cranberry red Platinum Milano and the Quadrifoglio got lots of attention. Adriana Wadley, Diro Alfa Romeo salesperson, told me at the show that owner Robi Thalmann enjoyed hosting the Brakes Clinic last year so much that he'd like to host another Clinic this year.

The Laguna Seca Time Trial follows on the 28th and March 1st. March 28th brings the first Tour which will end at the J. Paul Getty Museum on the Pacific Coast Highway halfway between Sunset and Topanga Canyon Boulevards. It is a recreation of a Roman villa with formal gardens. It houses a collection of Greek and Roman antiquities, 18th Century European decorative arts and Western European paintings from the 13th through the 19th centuries. But before we get to enjoy these is the real lure of the day: an Alfa Romeo caravan through the Santa Monica Mountains. The La Carrera Classic is back again the weekend of April 10-12. Last year AROSC's John Green, Robert Regenos, Mike Sperry and Charlie Thieriot took part in this 124 mile race from Ensenada to San Felipe. We'll hear of their plans at the March 27th meeting.


Our guru for the Engine Building Clinic was the 1982 SCCA National Rookie of the Year and the 1984 SCCA National MECHANIC of and Driver of the Year. He was crowned the D Production/GT3 NATIONAL CHAMPION in 1982, 3 and 4 at the SCCA runoffs held at Road Atlanta. 1977 AROSC President Dave Vegher will be the host on Saturday April 18th at his Veloce Motors West shop in Torrance. Pistons will be weighed, cams set and Dave's engine dyno will be humming. Whether you want to learn about full race or stock street engines, mark your calendar now.

Big Brother is alive and thriving in 1987. The LOS ANGELES TIMES reported on January 17th that "The Transportation Department levied a \$510,000 fine against Arizona because too many of its motorists exceeded the 55 m.p.h. speed limit. It marked the first time the federal government has taken sanctions against a state for failing to enforce the speed limit." California has shown data to Washington that it is just barely in compliance. It's a joke of course. Being in compliance means that 45-50% of the drivers are speeding. The threat of losing 10% of highway funds is what has kept many states from raising their speed limit. What do you think is going to happen here, now that Washington has begun to levy fines? Will California drivers voluntarily slow down so that we can avoid tax increases to make up for lost high-way funds? Will the CHP double in size to enforce the law even more vigorously? Will the CHP use radar or a new to America system made by Traffic Monitoring Technologies? Used for years in Japan and Germany and in use NOW in Galveston, Texas, this combination of radar and camera takes a photo of the license plate and driver's face of cars clocked speeding. No cars are stopped. It's painless until the ticket comes in the mail. Unmarked cars, radar fanatics, and now Candid Camera. Your AROSC joined the Citizen's Coalition for Rational Traffic Laws last year to help repeal the 55 law. Political pressure had better work or we'd might as well sell our Alfas and drive Yugos.





TIME TRIAL NEWS

ENTRE COMPUTER TIME TRIAL - #1
WILLOW SPRINGS - 1/24,25/87

Our first Time Trial of 1987 was wonderful for entrant and spectator alike. While you take your chances on weather in the desert this time of year, if you are lucky, it is often beautiful. We enjoyed one of those weekends. On Saturday, the sky was gorgeous. When you looked overhead, it was so clear that it looked almost black. At the horizon it was a baby blue color, and in between it was every shade of blue. It was freezing at night, warm during the day. The group was friendly, the pace relaxed, and the weekend was a great getaway requiring only a little over an hour drive and maybe forty-five bucks of hotel fare to insure not having any hassle at all. The hidden reward was that when the air is cold, the air density is high, therefore lap times are fast. And fast they were.

Henry Manney was the fastest Alfa but, being alone in his class, could not receive a trophy. As predicted, a number of people at the top of Class D last year couldn't resist modifying their cars any longer and moved into Class C. Alan Ward beat his customer, Fred Schuedekopp, both driving borrowed cars. Dino Crescentini tied Dick Richards' old lap record set in 1983, but Harold Rich set a new record in winning Class D. Harold is rumored to be handing out autographed pictures of his car now to any girl he meets. John Green broke the bellhousing in his Super (that's what you get for using Porsche parts in an Alfa) but Bob Regenos generously loaned him his GTV/6. Bob was apparently somewhat upset when John returned his car with smoke pouring out of every imaginable orifice.

Class E may become the most competitive class this year. Dick Richards held the lap record of 1:49.85, which he set in 1982. Bill Pringle, Rex Chalmers, and Andy Steben all broke the record! I guess Bill's year of retirement resulted in a large Testosterone build-up. Judy Illeman, who ran in Introductory Group something like

five times before she agreed to get a roll bar, was entered in Class G alone. So she was moved up to Class F, which she smoked. She broke Dan Ritter's Class G record by over FIVE seconds. I'll bet that Skip Farnsworth will now start recruiting people to run with Judy in her class.

Mike Sperry won Top Time Of the Day in his cute, little Ginetta. I hear that Mike is embarrassed because he outweighs the car. Other than Mike and Morris Kessler, Class M staged a spectacular display of unreliability. There's an Alfa dealer near you, guys. Class N was a mixture of everything: Vintage cars, modern sports cars, economy cars, luxury cars, and a pickup truck! (I not sure I'm ready for this.) In Class O the VWs of Jim Pizzuti, Peter Broen, and Jonathan Haines captured the first three positions. Kirk Tomassian showed alot of improvement by beating his estimated lap time by nine seconds. In the Renault class, Tom Cahalane and Mark DiBella got the top two slots, after they disintegrated a turbo the day before. Does anyone think that their car is running normal amounts of boost? If so, I have a bridge for sale cheap.

We finished Sunday right on schedule and Phyllis Gaylard, who is Director of Timing this year, had the results ready about five minutes later. Except for a blown fuse, the timer worked perfectly. We had a very good and unusual dinner at Villa Basque which thirty people attended. The dinner capped a very relaxing and different kind of weekend.





PREPARING YOUR ALFA FOR A CONCOURS.



Interior

Start by shovelling out all the debris from under the seats. Empty the ashtrays and wipe them out. Look inside the glovebox, removing all pizza coupons and chewing gum wrappers. Leave it clean and neat with owner's manual, registration, sunglasses, etc. - only the stuff that should be there. Check the trunk too - the tennis racquet and smelly sneakers will have to find anther home. Now vacuum everywhere (including the trunk), very well. Get that vacuum into all the nooks and crannies - up under the dash, behind the pedals, down in the gap between the seat bottom and back, etc. Use the best vacuum you have - if you have a household vac with a hose attachment or a shop vac, use it in preference to a cigarette-lighter powered car vac. Next step is to clean all vinyl, plastic, and rubber surfaces with a good cleaner like the one made by Armor-All. Don't forget the headliner - in fact, start with this and work downwards. Also don't forget to get into all the all the nooks and crannies, like the fins on the air vents and the the ribs on the pedals. Next, clean the seats and door panels. If they're vinyl, use the same cleaner. If they are leather or cloth, the bad news is that I have not yet found any cleaner that I am totally happy with. The upholstery cleaner made by Eagle 1, or one of the various aerosol products from Turtle Wax are the best of a bad lot. Now Armor-All all the plastic, rubber and vinyl except the seats and pedals slippery seats and pedals just don't hack it in an Alfa! Don't overdo it or everything will end up sticky. Use the Armor-All sparingly and buff out with a damp cloth. While the Armor-All is out, don't forget all the weather seal around the doors and trunk lid. Now for the seats (and door panels if they're not vinyl). I like Connolly Hide Food for leather, and nothing but a light brushing for cloth (be sure the seats are dry from the cleaner). Next, clean all the glass, inside and out. I use a "home brew" cleaner made as follows: Mix denatured alcohol (sold in hardware stores as shellac thinner) with distilled water in a ratio of about 1 part alcohol to 6 parts water. This cuts the film that builds up on the glass much better than anything else I know of. Just don't splash too much of it on the paintwork - it also removes wax! When cleaning the windows, don't forget to roll them down an inch or two to get at the line of crud that builds up where the glass meets the seal in the frame. Also don't forget mirrors, instrument faces, etc. When this is all done, vacuum the seats and carpet again lightly, to pick up any lint from your cleaning cloths.


