

It was party, party, party at the Las Vegas Time Trials last May 12th & 13th. With many of the original stalwarts not in attendance, the new blood carved a new plateau in the annals of Time Trial History. These neophyte charioteers are a most daring and fearless lot. a few are the romantic type, case in point, upon working corner duty, two perfect strangers discovered love and romance under the scorching Nevada sun. What with all the fast driving and coupled with glitter, bright lights and pulsating high rolling of Las Vegas the two Alfiste are now engaged to be married! Yours truly did not fair so well. After several practice laps I noticed the engine in my Guilia Super was down on power and I could tell something was just not right. Over the last month or two collector car prices have greatly stabilized, or, as in the case of Ferrari and Aston Martin, gone down. Any 105 or earlier series Alfa is still a bargain in my mind. Even 1900's at \$100,000 are a bargain, as their contemporary rivals the Siatas and Fiat 8V's are over \$250,000 and not much rarer.

The May 7th issue of AUTOWEEK has a good 164 article as dos the June issue of ROAD & TRACK. Too bad that in the R & T article they didn't say that the transmission spider gears broke due to some idiot making 7000 rpm, drop-the-clutch acceleration runs, and not to any defect in the car. Te article, due to this misleading fact, may actually turn away some potential 164 buyers.

New Alfas include a protection plan that includes free towing and a rental car in the event of a breakdown. It even includes free wiper blades and oil and brake changes for three years.

The June issue of CLASSIC AND SPORTSCAR has a test between a 2 litre GTV and a Lotus 2 + 2. Of course the Alfa comes out on top, in spite of the fact it was on 165mm wide tires.

My 2600 Sprint is still in the works. The good people at Ricambi found me a set of carb mounts, but they were \$600! The carbs have also been rebuilt, and the brakes are currently being done. If luck prevails, I'll have it ready for the June meeting; at least done enough to drive it. My Miata is a lot of fun but is not the perfect car the ads would try to make you believe it is. I would like to see it have better seats, opening vent windows, and a number of other minor changes.

We had some 50 entries at our first Las Vegas Time Trial, which was just enough to break even financially. (Actually, Charlie prevailed upon each participant to kick in another \$20 to keep the event from losing money and thus keep the whole program alive and well. From all reports, people were glad to do it.)ed. For those of you interested in racing, this is a very cheap way to go, and I would encourage you to contact Charlie Thieriot, our Competition Director, if you have any interest. The next Time Trial is late July (28 & 29)ed. at Willow Springs.

#### LAS VEGAS TIME TRIAL Chris Romine


Oh my, another reason to go to Las Vegas! The opening (reopening?) of the recently re-paved and improved 1.5 mile Las Vegas International Raceway road circuit proved to be yet another excuse to be entertained by this provocative place in the desert. While all Alfa Club time trials can be classified "high-adventure", our first-ever Las Vegas event ranked right up there. From the Friday night escapades in the Barcelona Lounge (you "rich racing folks", you) to the sight of Charlie Thieriot working in the pits Sunday night quieting the exhaust on his stunningly quick GTA for the drive home (how many vintage racers are doing that?), it was an adventure. The flat 8-turn road course was more challenging than first appearances suggested, and it was only after Saturday's very generous 75 minutes of track time for each run group that this gathering of mostly experienced drivers dialed in the circuit. The safety of open runoff areas encouraged aggressive driving, and while all 8 turns witnessed a car off the track at least once during the weekend, only Bettina Van Curen's Spider had its shape altered a little (which also gave Alan Ward a chance to drive yet another unsuspecting soul's pride and joy).

Saturday night's banquet was preceded by cocktails and lie swapping, and followed with a customized tour of The Strip in Harold Rich's motorhome, which also served as the timing and scoring "tower" the next day.

Sunday dawned another beautiful day. Ample track time was again available for morning practice. The afternoon timed runs saw Bud Clark culminate several years of effort by bringing home Top Time of the Day with his latest Saab Sonett race car in Class N. Charlie edged John Cote in Class A for fastest Alfa honors (by not lifting in turn 1?). Tor McPartland and Alex Brown drove GTV's to victory in Classes D and E, respectively, by large margins. Judy Illeman adjusted to the new track quickly and grabbed Class F while Si Robin took G in the family Spider. Kit Simmons drove his Mustang to 2nd in the fastest non-Alfa class, and Tracy Culp's Capri took Class O from Curt Hitchcock's "most driven entry" TVR. Class P, again the largest, saw Chuck Dedman edge Brian Lewis on the last lap, while Bill Peltola dropped down to take Q.

The success of this event, staged at a track none of us had ever seen, can be attributed to the continuing efforts of a veteran time trial organization and the enthusiasm of the competitors and course workers. There is no better value in competition driving today, and the instruction is FREE!. Next event is July 28-29 at Willow Springs. Come on out!
