

We have been talking to some of you about running. If you have some interest let a Board member know. We will put together a slate of candidates soon so that it can be published before the November meeting.



We have 2 types of programs.

In our Driving Schools you develop your track skills. In our time trial/race events you to use your developed skills to compete against other drivers on famous tracks. Both programs are 2-day events costing \$160-200.

AROSC High Performance driving school: (2 per year, spring & fall)

When was the last time you had a blast honing your driving skills on a <u>wet</u> skidpad in the desert? How about driving around the track refining your skills with your friends and some great instructors? Here is the opportunity to meet new friends and have some fun learning the limits of your car without the worry of a ticket or an accident.

The AROSC driving school has groups for all levels of experience, from the person who wants to test the limits of their street car, the Time Trialer who is looking for those precious tenths to edge out his class competition, to the Racer, who understands that what is important is not so much tenths of a second, but race strategy. The instructors for our school have a broad background of experience from Club racing to Professional Rally Racing. Get ready for a lot of seat time!

STREET DRIVING PERFORMANCE CLASS: Your chance to test the limits of your vehicle and yourself in a safe supervised environment. No flashing lights, no tickets, no worries! There is class time, skidpad exercises (a great experience in learning car control) and a lot of track time each day. This is the perfect class for new drivers. They will learn a lot meet new people and have fun too! Equipment requirements: you need a helmet, and open cars need roll bars.

NOVICE TIME TRIAL CLASS: The next step in your continuing driver training experience. You will learn how to take the basic techniques learned in the Street Performance Class, expand on them and refine them to prepare you for Time Trialing at the big tracks. Equipment requirements: as above, plus five-point harness and fire extinguisher.

ADVANCED TIME TRIAL CLASS: No beginners please! This class is for the serious driver who wants to shave a few more tenths off his/her lap times. We'll work on, mechanical tweaks, technique and mental strategies to help you drive a better prepared car, with better control and do it smarter with less wear and tear on your car!

RACE CLASS: If you are an experienced Time Trialer and want to start wheel-to wheel racing, or are already race qualified and want to learn more about racing strategy and passing techniques, and race starts, this is the school for you. See an Instructor or Director regarding special safety equipment requirements for race group.

All class levels have some class time where theory is discussed along with skid pad exercises, slalom work, and other activities designed to demonstrate how your vehicle responds and TRACK time where you can put what you've learned to the test. Believe us, it is all way too much fun!



Time Trial and Race weekend program: (Usually 5 events per year)

Ever wanted to take your car on the track and see what it will do? Well, AROSC offers you the opportunity to get "track active" in a number of ways, *all affordable*. Don't worry if you don't have an Alfa Romeo (although we love it if you do), you can enter just about any kind of car in our events

Time trial & Races are conducted on many famous tracks: Typically Willow Springs, Laguna Seca, and Buttonwillow, occasionally Sears Point, Thunderhill, Las Vegas and the California Speedway.

TIME TRIALS: A little less intense than "wheel to wheel" racing, Time Trials give you the opportunity to run at 10-10ths on a racetrack against the clock, competing against other drivers with similar cars for best time. Each event consists of a series of practice sessions (you get *lots* of track time) with the competitive timed laps at the end of the second day. For timed laps, we space the cars out to allow for a clean shot without the worry of traffic. Equipment requirements: helmet for you, 5-point harness and fire extinguisher for your car, and roll bars for open cars.

RACE: Want to mix it up, fender to fender with other cars? We have a class for this as well. The race class entrants do need to prepare their cars to a higher safety standard, but if you are willing to make the investment and you have the itch to race like the big guys or gals, we have a class for you.


October Wine Tour Details




The scene at the Concorso is full of neat cars. This is a pre-war race car which looks like the 158, but has a 12 cylinder motor now, probably as a result of racing post-war in South America. The 158 had a supercharged 1500cc 8 cylinder motor which was upgraded to a twin-stage blower with 360 Hp post-war.

Alfa Romeo Quiz

Test your Savvy

The following questions & answers are from the April, May, June, & July issues of 'The Alfa Rumor', newsletter of the Arizona Chapter, prepared by the Editor, Arno Leskinen.

<u>Ouestion #1</u>: Alfa Romeo won the Grand Prix (now Formula 1) World Championship three times. What were the years?


