

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
AROC Convention 2002: Costa Mesa, CA



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
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Time Trial: California Speedway at Fontana





Fisher Products, the sole importer for Abarth Exhausts refused to trade with me any longer. This was in 1970, all due to professional jealousy [FAZA being the Abarth auto and parts importer]. In 19721 introduced ANSA exhausts with 48 feet containers in full page ads. Their Abarth looks and trust turned to rust and broken pipes in 6 months. I gave refunds or replaced all with 7 BrOtHeRs Daytona Systems. It has been decades from their last error. Only recently 2 front sections of 1300 Alfa Spider systems had noise at the plenum.
