

# Swap Meet at Omega MotorSports




Now I am in real trouble. Besides the wife, I have the State of California against me.


## Directions:

<u>Driven Tourers</u>: we will be gathering at the nice fresh springy morning hour of 9:00 a.m. at the Walnut Grove Café parking lot adjacent to the Mission San Juan Capistrano for (additional coffee if needed and) a drivers' meeting.

<u>Cruisers:</u> If you wish to tour the mission, the doors open at 8:30 a.m. and admission is \$6. To get a jump on the weekend, rooms at the Mission Inn Motel [also adjacent to the mission and the Walnut Grove Café; (949) 234-0249] are \$135 to \$165, double occupancy.

The planned departure hour is 9:45 a.m. and the route will be coast range through the Cleveland National Forest on Hwy. 74 to Lake Elsinore.

We'll stay off the freeway and amble through the burgeoning 'burbs of Riverside County on pleasant two-lane roads to



Winchester for a cheese-tasting/shopping stop at the Winchester Cheese Company. Discovering the prize-winning gouda produced here was a value-added benefit for participants in the Club's fall Temecula Wine Tour and is a must-visit for those who may need a special something to spice up their picnics.

Fuel is (as expected) expensive inland, but recent reconnaissance showed Hemet and Ramona to have palatable prices.

The big formal stop is in Idyllwild for lunch at the county park to enjoy our picnic competition. Day use fees are \$2 per adult, usually paid through the honor system in deposit-box envelopes.



End of lunch is Escape #1. Those on tight turnaround schedules may bail here at 5,303 feet. Pack your parachutes.

Next, we'll follow Charlie & Bonnie's down-mountain itinerary through Garner Valley to Route 371 and Anza, Aguanga and Hwy. 79. These are fast, well-maintained two-lane country roads and the scenery is lovely. The 2003 twist comes as we transit Ramona and then do a little freeway flying through Lakeside, El Cajon, Grossmont, National City and Chula Vista.

Our final descent will off I-5 and Hwy. 75 and over the bridge to Coronado Island. Please note this Alfa-owner-friendly detail: there is no toll, either direction, on the dramatic arc that is the Coronado Island Bridge.

Saturday evening's beachhead will be the Coronado Inn, a cozy court at 266 Orange Ave., where we have 12 rooms blocked off until April 15. The one-night rate is \$102.60 (which includes taxes), with queen and king beds. Quadruple occupancy is OK, and suites are also available. Please make your own reservations promptly (before April 15) by calling (800) 598-6624. Do visit the Web site at <a href="www.coronadoinn.com">www.coronadoinn.com</a> for a look at the place.

After checking in and freshening up, the (optional) thought is to go straight down the road (Orange Ave.) to the Hotel del Coronado "for one" [as in a cocktail] to



see the newly renovated public spaces and beachfront amenities before coming "home" to the north shore for dinner at II Fornaio (on 1st Street). If you must, this can be Escape #2 for those who absolutely must return to L.A.

Finally, we're heading toward a group-sized corner in Il Fornaio for dining off the menu beginning at 8 p.m. Your tour organizers would appreciate a dinner RSVP to (714) 964-9650, no later than May 1.

On Sunday, the plan is to visit the back patio at popular and well-reviewed restaurant 222 in San Diego's upbeat and renovated downtown (pending RSVPs) at about 11 a.m. Afterward we can divide and conquer San Diego with shopping in the Horton Plaza area, checking out the *Star of India* and *Eureka* or diving into Old Town before back up the coast.


For those who wish to be included, but have not yet notified me, please contact me at my email address, included below, and let me know if you want to receive the reminders.

# **Dyno Day Revisited**

Peter Nitoglia of MagnaFlow Exhaust Systems has graciously offered to host another Dyno Day at his facility in Rancho Santa Margarita if we could find a good date in the May to July time frame, when there isn't a vintage or club racing event. He proposed that we might even establish an Alfa Power Challenge contest. This is a replay of the pre-convention dyno session held at his facility last July 3 with horsepower runs only, no tuning unless there is time left.

The board proposed <u>Saturday</u>, the <u>28th of June</u>, and Peter agreed. The hours will be from <u>9am to 12 noon</u>. He will have dyno technicians and others to help, plus they will set up some soda and chips like last time. They recommend that the first cars arrive at about 8:30 am so we can get going on the dyno right at 9:00. There should be time for 12 cars to run, and we will charge a nominal \$25 fee for benefit of the club.

The usual recommendations apply regarding what are and are not eligible cars for a dyno power run: no leaking or

overheating engines; fresh oil in sumps; good u-joints, tires, clutches and bearings. Regarding the contest, to keep things fair, we may want to also offer a power per displacement contest in addition to the "big dog" power contest, so that the big block guys do not overwhelm the small engines. Note: Alan Ward is <u>not</u> expected to run Phyllis's GTV that day.

To sign up, contact Phyllis Gaylard. A \$25 check reserves your spot if there are more than 12 people who want to run. See the masthead for address and E-mail.


