





(MOSTLY) ITALIAN CAR CARAVAN PREPARES FOR TRIP TO CONCORSO ITALIANO

Alfa Romeo, Maserati, Ferrari, Lamborghini, Lancia, Fiat, et al.

From August 15th to August 17th, the largest annual gathering of historically significant automobiles occurs on the Monterey Peninsula. For the car lovers among us, especially all things Italian, the weekend begins on Friday, August 15th with the Concorso Italiano. On August 15th, 16th, 17th the Monterey Historic Races are held at Laguna Seca and the Concours Elegance is held at Pebble Beach on August 17th. The real weekend, for many of us, actually starts on Thursday, August 14th as we start to assemble in San Diego and caravan through the day to Monterey / Carmel. Last year we had around 20 cars including Maseratis, Ferraris, Lamborghinis, Alfas, Lancia and a Porsche. The caravan starts in San Diego at the Anderson Pea Soup Windmill on Freeway 5 at 7:00 AM, with stops at UC Irvine and Thousand Oaks, and departs Santa Barbara at 11:30 AM. The route will take us over the San Marcos Pass, passed Lake Cachuma to Pismo Beach for lunch. After Pismo the caravan will split into 2 main groups – one heading up the Big Sur and the other pounding up the Salinas Valley. Details are posted below.

For Alfa owners this is only the first of the weekend caravans. On Saturday, August 16th, we drive our Alfas to the Alfa corral (sponsored by ARA) at Laguna Seca Raceway. At Laguna Seca, in addition to exciting vintage racing, there will be a major exhibit celebrating Ford's racing heritage. Sometime Saturday afternoon we convoy from the corral to the beautiful home of West and Maggie Clark, overlooking Carmel Valley, for a wine tasting (the Clarks have their own wines) some snacks and lots of camaraderie. This caravan requires a ticket to get into Laguna Seca, pre-purchase of a corral pass for \$1.00 and confirmation for the West's.

Returning is always open to more options, and the return caravan arrangements are usually best made in Monterey. Too many possible choices – Do I leave Sunday or Monday? Do I drive down the Big Sur or take 101? Then the really big decisions – Breakfasrt or lunch at the Nepenthe? Lunch in Pismo or Moro Bay? Dinner in Santa Barbara or Montecito? Nobody said life would be easy.

The Concorso is being held, for the first time, this year at the Black Horse Golf Course in Seaside, overlooking scenic Monterey Bay. The Concorso is honoring 40 years of Lamborghini and will feature the USA debut of the new V-10 Gallardo. A salute to significant Italian Spiders and Barchettas has been added. Many one-off designs originating from the drawing board of Pietro Frua will be presented to commemorate the 90th birthday of this late, great designer. The Concorso will present, on one fairway alone, over 400 Ferraris, many being judged in Concours competition. In addition to the nearly 1,000 Italian cars presented, the adjoining corrals, featuring Lotus, Porsche, Jaguar, BMW, Corvette, Mercedes, Bentley, Viper, Rolls Royce, et al., will offer hundreds of viewing and photo ops. The corral feature will be the 25th anniversary of the aerospace-designed Vector.

For the rich and famous among us (\$100 per person), or those who can get hold of guest passes, Sunday, August 17th is the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, considered to be the most prestigious gathering of (by invitation only) classic cars in the world. This year's features are Bugatti and 100 years of Ford.

Sunday morning on September 28th, 2003 the Alfa Romeo Owners of Southern California invites its members and members of the Orange County and San Diego Alfa Clubs to show off their sparkling clean Alfa's (or non-Alfa's) at our 2nd Concorso of the year. In addition to being a great warm up for "The Best of France & Italy" Concorso on November 2, 2003, this is also a grand opportunity to swap stories and photos with those who will have attended the "Concorso Italiano" in August.

The Concorso will be held in an exclusive parking area adjacent to the Ranger Station. The park opens at 7:00 AM and all cars entered for judging should be there by 9:30. Judging will start at 10:00. Ribbons for the Concorso will be awarded in 3 categories – Open Alfa (convertibles), Closed Alfa (hard tops), and Non-Alfa owned by a member. Recognition will also be given in 3 categories of picnic basket competition – *Molto Alfa* (Very Alfa), *Migliore Italiano* (Best Italian), and *Piacevole Apparenza* (Pleasant Appearance).


To reach the park take the Orange Freeway (#57) to the Imperial Highway offramp. Proceed west on Imperial for approximately ¼ mile to State College Boulevard, then left for 300 yards. —((Locate Craig Regional Park in Fullerton, ZIP 92835, with Map Quest))

Craig Regional Park, located at the border between Brea and Fullerton, is characterized by rolling hills, open space and a formal rose garden. A variety of trees are interspersed throughout the parks's 124 acres which provide abundant shade. A host of recreational opportunities exist at the park, including grassy play and picnic areas and bicycle and hiking trails. A 3 acre lake is open for fishing and the launching of radio controlled sail boats, and eight ramadas provide picnic tables and barbecues.

Alfa Racer in Need of Help - George Willet (AKA George of the North) has asked for help to locate information and documentation of acceptable modifications. This is a very urgent request as he needs the info ASAP and his question is very specific:

"In 1969 did the SCCA make a rule change that allowed 'update/upgrades' such that the 1965-68 Alfa Sprint GT 'two headlight' model could legally run the 1750cc motor in the B-Sedan class?" Note the specific years and the 1969 date is critical (cannot be later).

George has gotten some amount of 'word of mouth' information that supports this but is in real need of hard documentary evidence. If you know the answer and/or can provide some documentary evidence or assistance, please drop George a line at alfaman@fidalgo.net. As all of us that have researched early club racing history know, there is very little hard info to be found but we are always surprised at what someone has laying around in a storage box.

The result of this research will be published on the Alfa "Setup" page of the Bsedan Web Site and such findings will be added to other pages as information becomes available.

At a race not long ago we met the "gas man". No this is not a personal condition but he is a distributor for gas products such as welding gas, CO2 and others. He happened to notice drivers using CO2 in their tires and wanted to make the point that this can be a dangerous practice. According to "gas man", CO2 expands at a rapid rate when heated and he speculated that a race tire filled entirely with CO2 could easily explode once fully hot! A little research on this seemed to confirm what "gas man" said and one document put the issue in perspective with the simple statement, "...CO2's incredible expansion ratio, something like 3000 percent...". Yikes!

2 Charged With Illegally Importing Cars

A father and son were arrested yesterday on federal charges of illegally importing Italian-made Alfa Romeo sports cars that did not meet federal safety and air quality standards. Carlo Giordano, 66, and his son, Alessandro Giordano, 25, both of Nashville, were indicted last week on charges of defrauding the government by making false statements that the vehicles were legal in the United States, said Debra W. Yang, U.S. attorney for the Central District of California.

The elder Giordano is owner and president of Nashvillebased Autodelta USA Inc., and his son serves as the company's manager of operations. No Tennessee phone listings could be found for the men or the company and they could not be reached for comment.

According to the indictment, which originated in California, where officials said some of the cars were sold, the Giordanos would travel to Europe to purchase the cars. Authorities think the men sold or offered to sell about two dozen of the Alfa Romeos, including three in Orange County, Calif.

The men also face seven counts of wire fraud and three counts of making false statements in documents required by the Clean Air Act. If convicted, they could receive a maximum sentence of five years in prison for each of the 11 charges.

Autodelta also could face fines of more than \$5 million.

AROSC Member Jerry Galich 1932 – 2003

Jerry "The Greek" Galich:

World Champion Racer, Firefighter, Man Among Men

Husband, father, son and brother, loved and honored by all as honest, trustworthy, brave, industrious, passionate in life and love. He touched the lives of many in service to his country and fellow man.

Born in East Los Angeles to Ivan and Teresa Galich on September 27, 1932. He died at age 70, July 6, 2003 after fighting a long battle in treatment of multiple myeloma.

At age nine Jerry moved to Compton, CA, where he made many friends and met his future wife, Margie, at El Jay's Drive In Restaurant (Oh, "Them There Eyes!").

They were blessed with a wonderful son, Victor John, in 1957. They lived in Compton

for two years, Lynwood seven years, then moved to Huntington Beach where Jerry became an Engineer and later Captain on the Huntington Beach Fire Department. They built their dream home on a vacant lot on 10th Street, Huntington Beach and have lived there for 33 years.

Jerry became an Alfa Owner, along with other interesting cars, and had a small shop in Huntington Beach for

many years. He was often seen at SCCA races cheering on the Alfa racers, as well as at other Alfa events: Monterey Historics, AROSC Summer Party, etc.

Jerry retired from the Huntington Beach Fire Department in 1984 and soon thereafter became a Rotarian. Jerry served as Community Service Director in 1989-1990 and President in 1994-1995. He earned a Paul Harris Fellowship award.

He spent many hours volunteering until his health began to fail in 1996. He was diagnosed with advanced multiple myeloma in February 1998. He did long and furious battle with this cancer and achieved remission in April 2001. He

died July 6, 2003, after receiving two, ½ doses of a recently FDA approved drug called Velcade. This drug is owned by Millennium Pharmaceuticals. Thirty-six hours after receiving the second dose, Jerry was rushed to the Emergency Room. He was hospitalized for two weeks prior to his death.

He will be truly missed and cherished by his loving family and friends. "We love you Pops."




