


renowned for blending the iconic past with a compelling vision of the future. The designer of some of the most innovative automobiles of the last decade, J Mays uses a multidisciplinary approach which draws inspiration from fashion, architecture, and industrial design. Currently vice-president of global design at Ford Motor Company, Mays previously worked for Audi-Volkswagen and BMW, and his successes include the concept for the new Volkswagen Beetle, the Audi AVUS, and the redesigned Ford Thunderbird, among others. Mays won the Harvard Design School's annual Excellence in Design Award last February.

Mays explains that "every vehicle is futuristic, but it becomes retrofuturistic when you create a vehicle that is Mays was born in 1954, and studied commercial art and journalism at the University of Oklahoma. He graduated from the transportation Design program at Art Center College of Design in Pasadena in 1980. He spent 10 years with Audi AG in Germany before opening a Southern California design studio for the company. In 1997 he joined Ford Motor Company, where he is responsible for the design direction of the company's 8 marques: Ford, Mercury, Lincoln, Mazda, Volvo, Rover, Jaguar, and Aston Martin.






