

"Victory by Design: Alfa Romeo" is a pure treat for 'Alfisti'. This DVD is feature-length and covers most of the milestone sports racers and Grand Prix cars that established Alfa Romeo as one of the truly great marques in automobile history. An abreviated version has been shown on Speed Channel, but the DVD is better!

We are trying to arrange a bulk purchase for AROSC members and I would like to hear from anyone interested. The current price is \$24.99 plus S & H and I have seen them on ebay for over \$30 plus S & H.

Alain de Cadenet, a true authority on Alfas, particularly the pre-WW2 cars of Vittorio Jano and Enzo Ferrari, drives and appraises many of the actual cars that won the great classic races which would help create the Alfa legend that's still with us today.

Some of the superb Alfas featured include: the 8C 2300 Zagato, the actual car last raced by Enzo Ferrari as a driver. The actual P3 in which Tazio Nuvolari won the famous 1935 German Grand Prix. The only three 2900A racers ever built, together again for the first time since their Mille Miglia success of the mid 1930s. The awesome Monoposto B, winner of Grands Prix and the Mille Miglia. The unique 2900B Le Mans Coupe. The only surviving 12C Alfa. The Disco Volante. The Fangiowinning 6C 3000CM. The incredible Alfetta, winner of the first two World Grand Prix Championships in 1950 and 1951. The multiple European Championship winning GTA and GTAm. The TZ1 and racing Giulietta and Giulia range. The 33/2 Daytona, 33/3, and TT 33/12, which took Alfa Romeo to two World Sports Car Championships in the 1970s.

What makes this Alfa Romeo show such a must for the enthusiast, is that these important and valuable cars have been shipped to a series of international locations where director Tony Maylam and his production team have been able shoot the cars in action and capture them in superb widescreen photography with 'in your face' Alfa Romeo surround sound. It will be a very long time that so many important Alfas will be entrusted to a film company and shot in such an all-encompassing way.

A Website That Documents Exotic Car Wrecks


From the Los Angeles Times, Highway 1 Section, Wednesday, February 25, Dan Neil writes about a website that shows the need for our AROSC Drivers School for those who have more money than sense when it comes to exotic cars. As he states, "At the point where rich guys' funding exceeds driving talent, one can often find a tossed salad of shredded carbon fiber, crumpled aluminum and highly engineered junk, a.k.a. an exotic-car wreck." An anonymous 27-year-old Bay Area executive with a sense of black humor has posted pictures of these "mechanical pratfalls" at www.wreckedexotics.com. Fortunately, there were no Alfas shown in the worst categories, although one might be hiding in the 'ordinary car' section.


"Among the offerings on view: a \$600K Ferrari Enzo owned by a Tampa, FL RV dealer whose son gave it a \$400K rhinoplasty; an extremely rare Pagani Zonda whose owner took it curb surfing in Hong Kong; and a Ferrari 355 reduced to about 1771/2 after an unfortunate encounter at a railroad crossing." There is also a Mercedes 300SL Gullwing (punted off the Mille Miglia course in Italy), a Lamborghini Diablo with a flattened roof, a Jaguar XJ220, a Bugatti EB110 and a Vector, in various states of dishabille.

There may be a public service component to this website. The author of this site states that "It's only natural that at one point or another, you're going to push your limits. Hopefully, 'Wrecked Exotics' will make them stop and think about the consequences."






The overview from the building of the cars preparing for judging.









Wild Flower Rally

With All the Rain, There Must Be Flowers!

Tune up your cars. Check the brakes. Find the barf bags - it's Wild Flower Rallye Time! Those of you from last year's rallye know of my fascination with wickedly twisty roads. This year's course promises more of the same to test our fabulous Italian machines and driving abilities. What a great way to spend a day: your favorite car, your favorite driving partner, some great roads and hopefully wild flowers. With all of the recent rain, we should have vista upon vista of flower covered hillsides. Oh, and look at the road now and again too.

The AROSC Wild Flower Rallye will be April 18th, 2004. We will be starting at Michael Landon Park in Malibu at 10:00 am. Please be on time. Michael Landon Park is right across Pacific Coast Highway from Pepperdine. See map on page 9 -- Park is labeled Malibu Bluff Park in the map.

This year's first rallye will be a poker style rallye, not like last year when Norman, now known as Norman I, Rex, forgot to bring the cards! You will receive an instruction sheet and one playing card at the start. You will receive more playing cards at various checkpoints along the way and at the end. The best poker hand wins. This is not a timed event, so relax and enjoy. However, if you go over the allotted time, you will be disqualified. This is to keep things moving and not drag the day out too long.

It would be advisable for you to bring a clipboard and a pen so that you may check off the driving directions as you go. This implies that you will need to bring a co-pilot. Try not to bring someone that A) can't read B) gets carsick C) whines like a little kid or D) smells bad.


Remember to top off the gas tank prior to starting. There are NO gas stations en route. For those of you with thirsty Alfas, plan on a round trip from the park to the end of the rallye as about 60 miles or so. There are gas stations just before the park in Malibu. For those bladder-challenged members, facilities are to be found at the gas stations, at Michael Landon Park, and at one place about mid-rallye. Please prepare accordingly. Always make sure your Alfa is in good working order and check the tires and check the brakes! Always obey local laws and the posted speed limits. Anyone acquiring a little piece of paper from a local enforcement officer will be disqualified.

As mentioned above, the rallye will start at Michael Landon Park. The rallye will also end at Michael Landon Park. So, what this means is that if you get lost, head back to the park. Once everyone is present and accounted for, we will go to a local eatery for lunch. The restaurant will be somewhere in the Malibu area. We should be to the restaurant slightly before noon.

Jay Negrin and myself are busy putting the finishing touches on the rallye, so come out and support our efforts. Make your plans now and put the date on the calendar. Remember, this a great way to try to earn an award at the yearly banquet. I hope to see everyone from last year and a bunch of new faces as well. Rallye On!



AROSC kicked off our 2004 time trial program at Willow Springs just a bit later than usual, Super Bowl weekend (our events do sometimes separate the doers from the watchers!) The weather cooperated very nicely, with clear skies and negligible winds. Our turnout was a bit low with about 100 cars. We had a very clean weekend with (as I recall) only one slight car to car contact in the grid race and a rather spectacular blown engine. This was also our first weekend operating under the new draft Competition Code and Bruce Colby classified literally dozens of Alfas. With the new Code we did not intend to change any cars' existing classes, and I don't believe we did make any unexpected class changes.

The results are in last month's Alfacionada. If you look at that issue you will find some new faces and changes. In time trialing, Peter Kemos is now in Class C and came within a hair of a new track record (set by Chris Mayring last year). AROSC President Norm Silverman's Giulia Ti is now in Class H and he set the new Class H record at a blazing 2:02 (Norm vows to get under 2:00 next time). Dirk Stoehr showed up with no less than three cars and put plenty of points on the board. Sal LaMargra won his first first-place trophy in Class M. Bob Poulin and Claus Groth keep up a close rivalry in Class N, with Bob getting

top time of the day. Doug Adler brought his gorgeous just-completed Lancia 037 replica and it ran very nicely in Class N. Hans Stoehr won Class O in his Porsche, Todd Mc Nall continues to dominate Class P, and Class O



seems to be an MR2 affair. Of course, the winners of the newly-defined Classes K and L by definition set new records in those classes, we will see how long those records last!

The non-Alfa Race was quite an exciting affair; most of the entries were in Classes O and P, making for a lot of close action. Unfortunately, there was a lot of attrition among Alfas and the Alfa Cup race was rather thin by the end, with only three or four cars actually running at the end. There was a superb Alfa Cup grid race on Saturday, with a race-long duel between Jake Grubb and Larry

Our all-volunteer organization once again kept the weekend running in a most professional manner. Greg Nelson ran the Tower, Dennis Fibrow ran the Grid, Terry Watson ran Registration in his usual professional way; Brad Gray was as usual active in many capacities; Paul Ellis ran Tech Inspection. 








