



AROSC/Storm Karting: 3-Hour Go Kart Enduro

Last summer, my brother Mitch and several other club members became involved in a racing series hosted by Storm Karting (www.stormKartin.com) at a parking lot course on the grounds of Irwindale Speedway. This group operated an "arrive and drive" go-kart program which not only included a weekly spring championship series, but also 3 hour endurance races on a pretty much monthly basis. The course is a pretty much constantly changing 6 to 9 turn affair, probably a little less than ¼ mile in length.

Beginning in August, four of us (Mitch, Greg Nelson, Dennis Fibrow and I) began entering a team (Team Hang On) in the enduros and, at the time of the October Willow Springs time trial, Greg came up with the marvelous idea of staging a 3 hour go kart enduro through Storm for AROSC members. With the help of the rest of the Storm Karting staff, he actually pulled off this short notice concept, and the event was held at high noon, Saturday, November 20.

Six club teams of four members each were entered. Also participating was an exhibition team consisting of 4 Storm Karting staff members (Team Storm, although the name seemed to change with each pit stop).

The Karts are full fendered affairs with roll bars and 4-point harnesses, powered by four cycle engines which are not particularly fast off the line, but eventually develop quite a head of steam. And that's the trick – keep up the momentum. The fenders suggest the possibility of some contact – ramming will get you a black flag; but rubbing's racing.


Rules: Karts and positions were randomly selected (Team Hang On drew the pole; Team Storm started last). Six pit stops/driver changes were required over the 3 hours (penalty stops didn't count): briefly, the driver pulls into the pits, exits the kart and pit lane, and the reliever enters the next kart in line (never the same as the one just exited, which then advances into the line for a future reliever).

It was a very good and entertaining race for everyone. The last couple of hours saw a pitched battle for the lead between Team Storm and Team Hang On and, at least until the next time, Team Hang On got the bragging rights for AROSC.

Maybe next time we'll even have trophies. Thanks to all who participated, and we're definitely making plans to do it again.



Remembering Milt Minter

The AROSC has lost one of its finest instructors, and I have lost a dear friend. Milt Minter died after a long fight with cancer on December 23, 2004.

Anyone who was a part of sports car racing in the U.S. during the 60s and 70s knew the term "Donkey Bop". It was Milt Minter's pseudonym, his handle, his way of speaking. The first thing you'd notice when you met Milt Minter was his enthusiasm for motor sports, his warmth, and his gravelly and unmistakable voice. "Donkey bop" was Milt's way of saying "don't give up!" Milton Nelson Minter never gave up.

Milt Minter began racing sports cars in 1953, and went

on to become a twotime SCCA National Champion. In his career, he won championships in the Trans Am series, and he was runner up in the 1972 Can Am Championship, beating Mark Donohue, Jackie Stewart and Dennis Hulme!, He drove for N.A.R.T., racing several times for Ferrari at LeMans,

Ferrari at LeMans, Brad with Milt and his Porsche he won IMSA races driving for teams like Toad Hall Racing and Interscope. And Porsche awarded him the "Pedro Rodriguez Trophy" in 1971, for being the most aggressive driver on the planet.

My first memory of Milt Minter was from Laguna Seca, at the Can Am race in 1972. Milt was driving a Porsche 917 for Vasek Polak. I was eight years old; I shyly approached this road racing legend to ask for an autograph. 25 years later, I called Milt, and asked him if he'd be interested in instructing at an AROSC Driving School. He accepted, and my friendship with Milt was born.

Milt also raced Alfa's. He drove for Otto Zipper in the Tipo 33 Alfa Romeo Can Am car, starting with Laguna Seca in 1973. I was fortunate enough to be there. Milt was unfortunate enough to have a broken neck, from an

accident the week before. To alleviate Milt's pain, his crew duct-taped his helmet to the roll bar! He finished 5th, behind Mark Donohue, Hurley Haywood and the other Porsche 917s. Milt drove the Alfa for the rest of the '73 season, and in the first race of the '74 season.

I have had the pleasure of being a houseguest at Milt's home, and the honor of instructing by his side at several AROSC schools. The biggest thrill of my racing life was when Milt called to ask me to co-drive with him in the POC Tribute to LeMans. Wow! 30 years after I asked him for his autograph, I'm going to get to co-drive with him in an endurance race! Unfortunately, our car had mechanical problems, but the trip to and from the track

in Milt's camper was priceless! Then there was hotly-contested battle between Milt and I at the AROSC Enduro a couple of years back. I was all over Milt, and he taught me a thing or two about how to keep someone behind you! I'm usually very focused in a race situation, but chasing Milt, I couldn't help but

think about all of the great drivers in the world that had been in the exact same position, it was very humbling.

Milt called me a couple of weeks ago to say "the bastards say I've only got a month to live. I've had a pretty good life, though". Yeah, I'd say....

Milt Minter was a one-of-a-kind. He didn't give a damn about playing to the media, or about racing theory. He was just fast.

I will always remember that after each race I drove, Milt was there with a cold beer and a "Donkey Bop" for me.

I'm bringing the beer this time, and "Donkey Bop", Milt Minter. I'll miss you.




