

(DNF) I also competed in my first official Alfa Cup Race. I must say that exiting turn 9 while being passed on the right and left brought back memories of the 1960's. My door handles were still there.

No one who attends these events can ever say enough about Bruce Colby, Dennis Fibrow, Greg Nelson and the crew that put these weekends together. If you've never been, make a New Years Resolution to attend one next year and reeeaally have good time. The first quarter schedule – Competition Weekends and School weekend are posted on the web site.

The 'Best of France and Italy' Car Show, with good weather predicted, will be over by the time you read this. However, the weekend after the General Meeting we will be off and drinking again over the roads of the Central Coast. 


Newsletter Changes -- We Want Your Opinion
















Here's how to get there:

everything humanly possible out of that car? We have a picture of him lifting the right rear wheel in the air on the way around turn 5)







There is more to the ALFA club than just driving a car on the track, as there are also sentimental memories to be had as well!








