





Fifth Annual Spring Driving Tour Ascends to Big Bear

The traditional "Palms to Pines" Spring Driving Tour has morphed yet again, but it will be the same scenic motoring adventure on interesting back roads of SoCal, complete with interesting and arcane landmarks, a swath of history and the flourish of twisties before we reach our destination. Save the weekend of May 19-20 – it is a guaranteed fun-for-all!

This year's tour will begin in central Orange County, slice through the Chino Hills on Hwy. 142 and pause at the historic Graber Olive House in Ontario for a tour, olive sampling and our famous juried picnic. After lunch we'll climb the San Bernardino Mountains on Hwy. 38, to take the back way in to Big Bear, ascending to 8,443 ft. at Onyx Summit before sliding down to 6,000-something ft. at lake level. After breakfast and a walk/shop tour of Big Bear Village, we'll descend via Hwy 18 and 30 early Sunday afternoon.

We're staying the night at the Black Forest Lodge and Cabins. Mid-May is the height of the off-season, there are plenty of rooms, and unlike last year, you have several choices. To ensure that you get what you want, please reserve early! Visit their website

(www.BlackForestLodge.com) to check it out, but call, do not reserve online (it costs more). Lodge rooms are a


whopping \$75 double occupancy (queen bed, ¾ bath and fireplace). Spa suites (king beds with kitchenettes) and cabins are \$110 – some have wood-burning fireplaces and in-room Jacuzzis. Pets are welcome; we will be bringing our co-piloto, Cody Jones. Call 909-866-2166, and don't forget to say you are with the Alfa Club. If you have any difficulty, ask for the owner, Sam Baca.

Our new tradition of dining at an authentic Italian dive is very much alive for this tour. We will go to Paoli's in The Village for a family-style evening meal. Their tagline is "Your Beautiful Mother is Our Only Competition". Breakfast is a nice five-block walk from the lodge at the newly renovated Backyard B's BBQ, which overlooks the lake and features sturdy mountain egg dishes and a "build-your-own bloody" bar.

Foot-touring The Village will be a fun way to settle breakfast before heading out of town on the west-side road. There are gift and consignment shops, an art gallery or two and lots of fresh mountain air.

If you've never driven the Spring Tour, if you haven't been to Big Bear in years (as we haven't), if you've always wanted to know how Graber olives come into being, this is the trip for you. And, there may be some surprise fifth anniversary prizes awarded, so all you veteran participants should think about not missing this event.

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
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
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

Robert Petersen: 1926-2007

Robert Petersen, the self-taught publicist turned publisher and real estate magnate whose fortune gave Los Angeles one of the world's great automotive museums, died March 23 at age 80 after a brief battle with cancer.

He was the founder of Petersen Publishing which included Hot Rod, Motor Trend, and more than two dozen other mazagines covering cars, hunting, photgraphy, sports and beauty. He also helped establish the Petersen Automotive Museum in 1994 as a part of the Natural History Museum. After that organization had financial troubles, he funded a non-profit organization that now operates the Automotive Museum.

As a result of his love of cars and his magazines, he helped create and feed the American obsession with the automobile. He also loved hunting and the outdoors, taking annual safaris in Africa and India for game-hunting and photography.






