








Jim & Paula Lightfoot Tour Greece Isles







The February meeting will be held at the Autobooks store in Burbank. Guess what the specialty of the house is? There may be an author present as well as the only midget racer powered by Alfa! There may be some other special treats as well.

1. Pre-meeting browse & meeting: Arrive at Autobooks/Aerobooks Burbank early Saturday morning. Traffic will be light. The closer to 8:00 people can get there, the better the parking situation. We should all plan to arrive by about 10:00 AM to have time to brouse and bench race before the 11:00 AM meeting.

From the south, take the 405 north to the 101. Go east on the 101 (marked as south on signs). Where the 134 splits off, stay to the left and take the 134 to Pass Avenue. Turn left on Pass, go about one mile to Magnolia Blvd. Turn right on Magnolia, go past Hollywood Way, and Autobooks is on the right

2. Lunch break: When we are finished with the meeting and have spent our all on books and stuff, we will head down the road a couple of miles for lunch at Bob's Big Boy in Toluca Lake, the favored hot burger joint in the area.

Leave Autobooks, turn left (south) on Hollywood Way. Continue to Alameda Ave. Cross over the freeway and stay to the right as Riverside Drive merges in from the left. At 4211 Riverside Drive is the historic Bob's Toluca Drive In. We shall endeavor to have a large table and nearby booths.

Bob's is a great coffee shop with bargain prices that offers a traditional American style menu. Bob's is an excellent choice for breakfast which is served there 24 hours/day. For lunch try the original Big Boy combo for a tasty and filling double-decker burger. A **Senior Savings** of 10% off the total check is offered to those age 55 and over.

This Bob's restaurant was built in 1949, and is the oldest remaining BOB'S BIG BOY in America. It was designed to incorporate the 1940's transitional design of streamline modern style while anticiapting the freeform 50's coffee shop architecture. The towering BOB's sign is an integral part of the building design and its most prominent feature. The restaurant was honored in 1993, receiving the designation as a "STATE POINT OF HISTORICAL INTEREST" by the state of California.

3. Grand Finale: In keeping with the hot rod heritage at Bobs, Feb. 24 is also "Deuce Day." It is the 75th anniversary of the day Henry launched the Ford V8. So, for those who have not had enough automotive fun and history, we can continue on to the Petersen Museum at Wilshire and Fairfax in L.A. and revel in some of the several hundred '32 Fords of every persuasion that are slated to show up.

The most direct route is to get back onto Alameda Avenue, turn left at the freeway entrance and go west on the 134. It blends back into the 101, continue on to Laurel Canyon Blvd. Get off at Laurel Canyon and go south. Continue over the hill, and when it splits off into Hollywood Blvd, go east on Hollywood to Fairfax. Turn right and continue south to Wilshire and the Museum. I have no idea of what the parking situation will be on that day, but it is sure to be a little chaotic. Wilshire Blvd. may even be closed off to park some of the '32 Fords. It should be worth the slight hassle, however.

And then, having absorbed as much '32 Ford as possible, you're on your own.



Back to the Beach Alfa Concours in Malibu March 4 at Pepperdine University

Back by popular demand and always a treat, the first of three club concours events will be held this March 4, 2007 at Pepperdine University in Malibu, CA. This is a great event that hopefully encourages those of you with nice Alfas and other interesting stuff to get it cleaned up and out for a drive through some of the most splendid scenery in the world.

Many of the roads leading to and from the campus are breathtaking and you can pick your route from mild to wild. Some groups have been known to form early at the Coffee Roaster in Calabasas and take a 'spirited route and pace' through some of the tighter canyon passes. Interested yet? Ok, maybe a little more calm cruise for the misses or the ancient iron... then bring a picnic for the concours or choose some of the cozier eateries in Malibu like Duke's, The Reel Inn, Neptune's Net or maybe Coogie's. The list goes on and the sky is the limit!

The Concours traditionally starts at 9am with judging starting promptly at 10am and awards handed out about 12 noon. Competitors get there as early as 8am for best placement and to get the last bits of road dust off. Club donation of \$10 gets your car judged in one of several different classes including Open, Closed, Daily Driver, Non-Alfa, and Race Prepared. Multiple ribbons will be awarded in most of these classes with special awards and gifts also to be presented. Picnics again will be judged with theme awards for 'Best at the Beach', 'Very Italian', and 'Automobili Ephemerata'.

Happily I have been appointed to serve a fourth consecutive term as your Concours Chair. I, of course, directly correlate that success to the enthusiasm/fanaticism that is the spirit of our club. More of you continue to participate by bringing some wonderful cars to our shows and track events. Members are seeking out, repairing, restoring and preparing some wonderful older cars and having a lot of fun, in turn keeping this marque vivacious and alive here in SoCal. Good on you guys and gals!

So the upshot is clear-Get the car cleaned up, have a good time with friends, go on a wonderful drive through spectacular scenery and have lunch with a special person. Come and join us with or without an Alfa... this is maybe one of the best places to find a nice example! When you arrive at the campus (Pepperdine University is located at 24255 PCH., Malibu, CA. 90263) enter from the Malibu Canyon entrance and pause at the guard's booth. Inform them you are with the Alfa group and they will flag you ahead. Then just follow the signs. For those of you returning from previous years, be aware that there may be a new location this year so look sharp.

Check this stuff out for its wicked enzyme cleaning action on wheels and everything alloy. Hove the way it seems to eat brake grime and dirt. After liberal spray, follow up with a soft brush and then a micro fiber towel to agitate the cleaner and wipe down the crud. Punch up the cleaning power with really hot water that you dip and rinse the towel in. Ssssteamy.... RACING IN THE DEEP FREEZE -- BUT NO SNOW THIS YEAR!
















