









## July 28 Meeting - Brix Wine Bar, Sunset Beach, 7:00 PM to 10:00 PM



## Go Kart Races at Dromo One --Enduro in Anaheim

Terry Major can be unbridled energy. He pretty much single-handedly scheduled and arranged the AROSC Go-Kart 2-hour enduro for club members and acquaintances at Dromo 1 in Anaheim. Through his efforts, 40 drivers signed up for 10 teams, coming from as far away as Santa Barbara (Todd McNall).

Dromo 1 is an indoor facility utilizing 4-cycle gasoline karts on a semi-slick 7-turn short course (no more than a quarter mile). The lap-times were in the mid-20 second range, and while the karts are heavily bumpered, contact is seriously discouraged.

The idea behind this event is that it is supposed to be pure fun: no points, no egos, nothing to prove. While that's certainly the way it probably was for the non-racer acquaintance participants, it is apparent that racers would find it difficult to control their competitiveness even if 2 of them were rolling trash cans to the curb.

Did we have fun? Oh yeah, tons of it, although some of us probably had to let the adrenalin neutralize after the race before we realized it. There were, of course, some grumblings about the officiating (i particular, the black flags and visi to the "sin bin", although there were remarkably few of those, given the crowed), but we were all, for the most part, wonderfully polite to each other (at least off th track). The last 10 or 15 minutes of the race did begin to resemble the last minute of the last round o a prizefight, and while the "no bumping" signs were halfheartedly displayed, the black flag disappeared during the race's conclusion.

Hopefully, the results with all teau participants will show up in time for submission with this article, but a few notes:

Ten team captains were chosen from club driving instructors and officers, and they in turn chose their teams through a semi-random/blind procedure.

Rick Econony (Yellow Team) toc pole, but Mitch McKibbin (Orang Team) became the first breakout leader, putting a lap between he and everyone else by the end of his half-hour run. Fastest lap wer to Team Red's clean-up driver

Todd Brainard, represented to be a professional go-kart racer, at 24.2 seconds (or something), although our own Greg Nelson was running 24.5s at the end, attempting to make up a multiple-lap deficit.

Team Blue was the "kids" team (the only non-random team), and they demonstrated style and savvy, running as high as third for a while, before finally settling into sixth.








