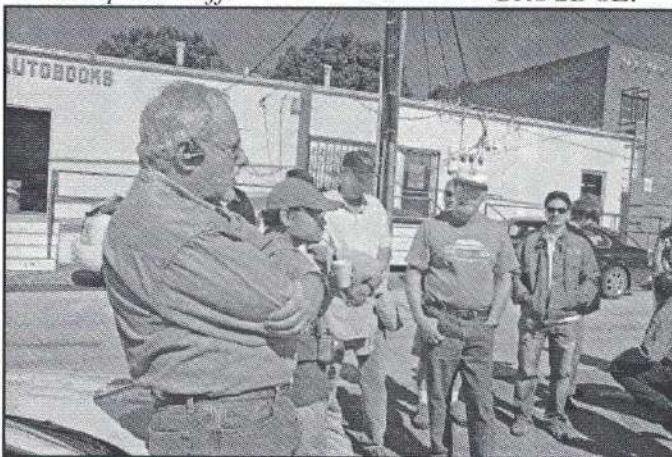

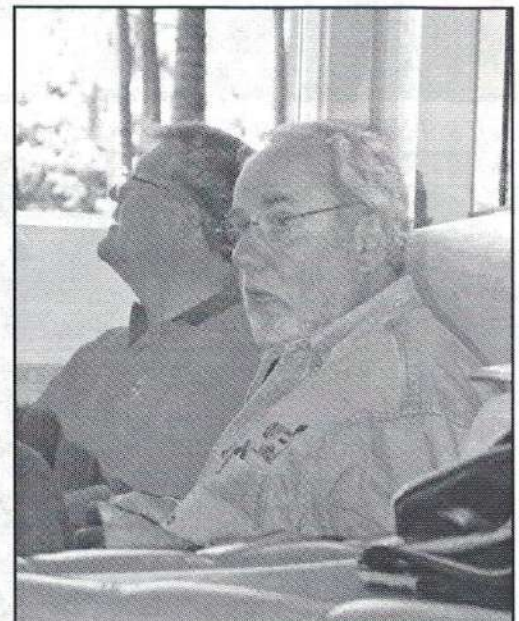

Join us on March 24 for a luncheon, speaker, and wine tasting at the historic San Antonio Winery.

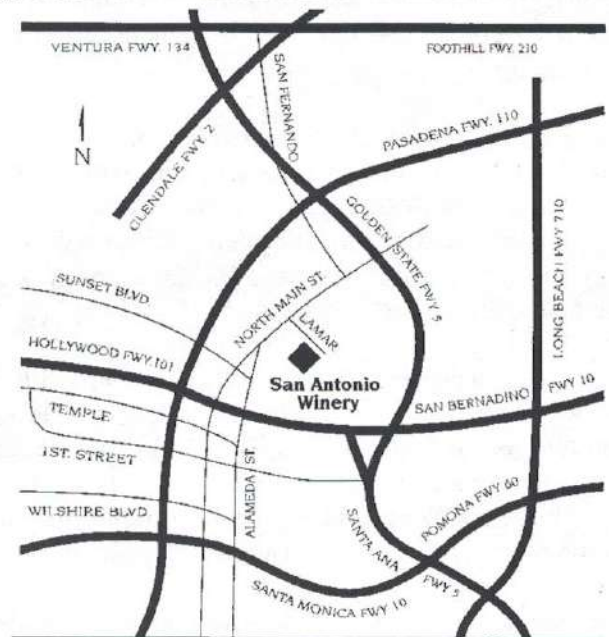
This is an oasis of good living in the heart of the city. The San Antonio Winery is a cultural historic landmark established in 1917.

Drivers School, Streets of Willow - February 3-4 *A Family Affair*

It certainly wasn't the biggest crowd attending one of these schools, but those not there missed an outrageously good time. Far and away, the largest group was Street Performance, with a wide array of vehicles ranging from race cars to a 427 Cobra replica and a Shelby GT-H (Hertz Rent-A-Car commemorating the memory of the Shelby GT350H, which was allegedly regularly rented and raced in SCCA events in the 1960's; there was a true story about a 289 Cobra driver pulling an engine out of one to replace the blown motor in his cobra, then reinserting the engine and returning the car).

But we digress. Steve Hamilton had his usual fine ensemble of instructors, ranging from veteran racer and guest instructor Alan Ward and resident celebrity and champion Tony Adamowicz, to relative rookie instructor Terry Major, who proved to be very capable and enthusiastic in his direction of Race Group.

This was the day of the kids: the Fibrow's son, Tim was in the MR-2; the Majors' daughter Danielle was in their MR-2; Mike Easterman's daughter was in his Mustang; Bob Polin's two sons, Matt & Will, monopolized his BMW; and Andrea was in the company car (a bit more power and weight than she's used to).

Rob Rhodes brought a new Mustang to Race Group, a 1967 hatchback dubbed "Junior" which was pretty much on asphalt for the first time. It proved a handful with power steering, shifting and suspension issues, but Rob wrestled with it all weekend long, and it got on the trailer Sunday afternoon under its own power. The car has possibilities.

The persistence award should go to Tony Presto, who spent the entire weekend trying to get his Mazda under power when making right turns (it ran perfectly for NASCAR ovals), finally getting it right and finishing second (behind Matt Polin) in the practice race; and Tomo Bullum, who lost a blower on his MR-2 early, yet soldiered on till the end. There were a couple of minor incidents, which can occur when a bunch of cars get together and go fast, but, on balance, it was a very good weekend.

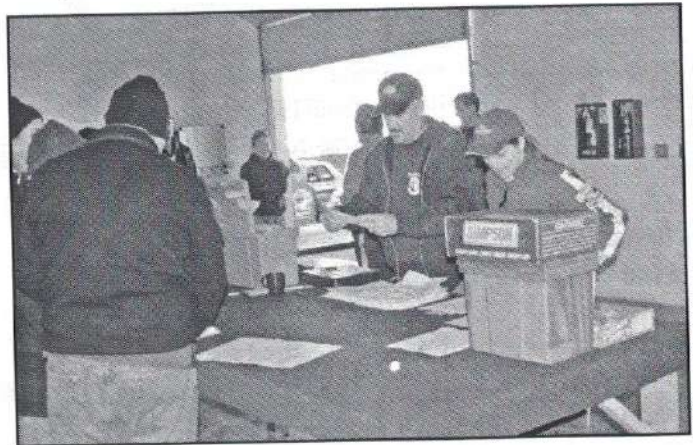
In the simulated time trial, Andrea came thundering down the front straight faster than anyone had ever seen her go.

And, what surprise to everyone in Race Group, as Paul Blankenship grabbed the wrong flag and started the race with the checker.

We couldn't close without a tip of the hat to Jodi Fibrow for planning and setting up a mini grill with minestrone soup, brats and burgers for all on both days. She conscripted yours truly to tend the grill and perhaps I've found my real calling as a short order chef.

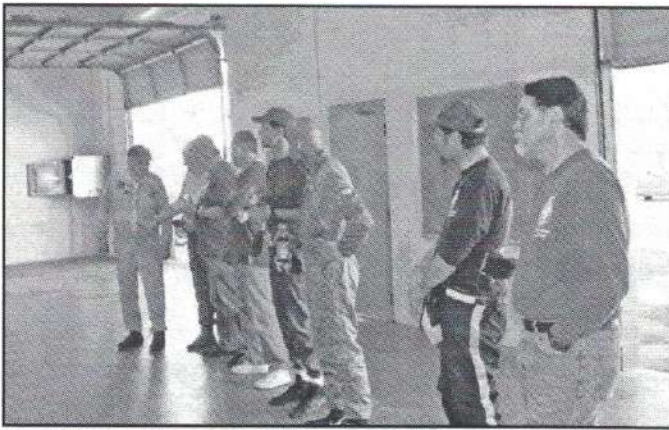

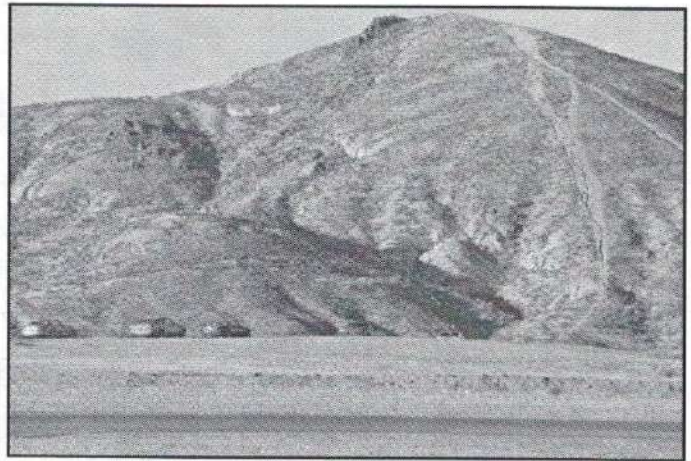
