






After missing the August

Summertime at the Streets

AROSC Driving School, Sept. 1 & 2

At the time trial/race at Willow Springs last January, it was so cold that a Sunday afternoon high of about 35 degrees was greeted by observations that it was finally warming up.

At the streets of Willow Driving School on September 1 and 2, 2007, we came full circle on the weather. it"). He puts his foot down in that thing, too.) Go Fred!










