## The Tech Guy ... *Don't Lose Your Cool!*

---

Returning from our June visit to Shin Yoshikawa's shop in Lebec, I took the long way around through Lockwood Valley. It was a beautiful drive that took me into Ojai, just in time for the Lavender Festival, but in the heavy traffic the Montreal started to over-heat. Now, this is a problem I have never had in the Montreal. Between the water radiator and the oil cooler, the temperatures have always been rock steady, even at 110° in Tucson. This was unusual, so when I got home I looked into the problem, but everything checked out OK. The radiator was down a little on coolant, but when the car warmed up, the electric fan came on at the right temperature and everything seemed OK. I ran a pressure check on the cooling system and it didn't seem to be leaking, but I replaced the radiator cap as a possible source of the coolant loss. I then filed the information away as something to keep in mind if I had a similar problem again.

Then came our annual Wine Tour in July. On the drive north, I got tied up in traffic in Santa Barbara (what else is new?) and again the engine temperature went up. Once in clear traffic the temperature came back down. This made me suspect the cooling fan, but when I had last checked it out it was working OK. The car had no problems during the Wine Tour, but I made sure that I left early enough to avoid the Santa Barbara traffic.

While at the Wine Tour hotel, I did do a little investigating and saw that when the car heated up the cooling

fan was not coming on as it should. By bypassing the fan thermal switch I could get the fan to come on. That pointed to the problem being the fan thermal switch. So, no problem, just get a replacement switch when I get home.

Now, I don't know how many of you have tried to buy parts for a Montreal. Some parts are easy since they are used in common with other Alfa models that were sold here. But of course the fan switch is not one of them. The parts book gives it a 105.64 part number prefix, which means that it was first used on the Montreal. Other Alfas sold here did not use electric fans until many years later.

I went online to <http://www.alfamontreal.info/> and checked out the Montreal page created by Bruce Taylor. While there were no specifics about the fan switch, but from information on the page I was pretty sure that I could get the fan switch from several suppliers in Germany or from Alfa in Italy. I knew that later Alfas used an electric fan so I looked at Alfa part suppliers here in the 'States. International Auto Parts has pictures of the parts on their website, so I started there, where it appears that the later Alfas used a switch with pigtail wires connected to it while the Montreal just had spade connectors.

I then remembered that Fiat also used an electric fan, and that a radiator man has thought the Montreal radiator came from a Fiat due to the looks of the fan switch. So I checked out a switch for an early 70's Fiat and

the picture looked just like the one in the Montreal. Looks can be deceiving. Was it the correct thread to fit the Montreal? I did a further check on the Internet for a Fiat fan switch. I found one from an Asian supplier that showed a picture of the same switch and listed the threads as M22x1.5, the same as the Montreal. So I ordered the part through Vick's Autosports (lower price than IAP). The part fit perfectly into the Montreal radiator. The only difference was the on/off temperatures. The Montreal switch turns on at 92°C and turns off at 82°C. The Fiat switch turns on at the same 92°C but turns off at 87°C. The result is that the fan will turn on and off more rapidly, but will be on for a shorter period of time. This should be no problem.

So the fan situation is solved, and I now have no worries about driving the Montreal in traffic.

This experience got me to thinking about a backup system. Many people have installed a bypass switches for the fan on the dashboards of their cars. This allows them to turn on the

fan at any time. So I thought about installing such a fan, along with a light to tell me that the fan is on. Not wanting to drill holes in the dashboard I thought about an alternative. I pulled out the wiring diagram and I found my answer. The Montreal has an electric rear window defogger. Due to bad conductors it has never worked since I acquired the car and, besides, who needs a defogger here in sunny California? The good part is, the defogger switch has a built-in light to show that it is on. All I had to do was run a wire from the defogger relay in the engine compartment to the radiator fan switch. It took me about 15 minutes to get everything installed and I did not have to make any holes in the dashboard.

There are two lessons to take away from this story. First: even when a problem seems to go away, it is still there and will show up again. Don't ignore it. Second: if you think about it a little you can usually come up with a simple neat solution for a problem, but it is usually not the first one.


For next year, a suggestion was made to call in the pizza orders from the winery. All in all, it was a satisfying afternoon.
