Alfa Fun at Willow Springs

An AROSC track weekend experience

Some months back I decided to take a trip out to Willow Springs to see what the "Alfa Romeo Experience" was all about. Although our Competition Group has passed on many great stories to us, I believed it could also be a fine destination for those of us who wanted to view some Alfa Romeos in their natural habitat, get to know how it all works doing a few laps following an instructor,

and then moving on and up to possibly better things on the track.

Well I must say, that the ideas I had conjured up were more than rewarded last weekend with a very educational, enlightening and eye opening visit to Willow Springs with a few others who have been enjoying themselves for a number of years.

I congratulate our team of dedicated volunteers who worked tirelessly managing all the cars and drivers that showed up to enjoy what they have taken on as a hobby, and I must say they were very professional on and off the track.

My day started at 10AM on Friday October 8 leaving from Fountain Valley, and by 12:20PM I arrived at the Cat House, an exotic feline rescue and breeding facility just 5 miles from the Willow Springs Track in Rosamond. I took this "Cat House" option, recommended by the regular attendees at the track to get an idea as to what else there is in the neighborhood so that future AROC members might also like this option. Well worth the visit and would recommend showing up at the facility at feeding time around 4PM. (FYI en route are High Desert Winery, Agua Dulce Winery, and others.)

After an hour viewing, I moved on

to Willow Springs Race Track 4 miles further on to check in and see who may have arrived, get a feel for who was there, find out just what is needed to get ready for the track the next day, and of course what my tasks might have included.

Interestingly enough many of the guests had already arrived, were unpacking cars, checking tires, brakes, engines and from what I could make out, getting their camps ready. This consisted of motor homes, pickup trucks, trailers, barbecues, dogs and children. This sets the scene for a wonderful weekend for the driving experiences ahead.

AROSC has an arrangement for attendees with the Oxford Inn, on K Street, Lancaster. It's just 23 miles back down the highway and a good facility for only \$107 per night, which by the way includes 2 drinks at the bar in the evening and breakfast each day.

In the evening I got together with Norm Silverman and Don Wagner and we were able to discuss what was needed of me for

The participants had already arrived and were setting up camp that comprised motorhomes, pickup trucks, trailers,

Saturday morning. I helped with the registration of drivers and also being the gofer, which was really needed for the weekend as the club was a little short of usual staff.

Saturday, 6:30AM, time to leave after breakfast for the track as registrations opens for all drivers at 7AM. There were drivers already waiting and eager to get signed up and then attend the 7:30AM drivers

meeting. All the paperwork detailing pre-registered drivers was with Don Wagner, so all that was needed were last minute driver registrations, detailing name, tech sheet, type of car, color, the drivers proficiency. And if not prepaid payment on the spot this was entered manually.

This all went well and afterwards I got to look in on the "Driver Meeting", where such things as safety, what the colored flags mean, on-track and in-paddock safety rules were reviewed. Then it was "off to the starting grid for the first driving session.

During the day the participating drivers and spectators were updated with announcements about what classes or groups were up next.

What classes of drivers were needed could be heard all over the area via loudspeakers. I found everything at Willow Springs to be very professional. Don Wagner runs a tight ship and the cooperation of the volunteers around him made me feel very comfortable that AROSC was running a wonderful outlet for interested drivers, future participants and spectators who wanting to do something quite different.

Norm Silverman and Mike McKibbon conducted a meeting for the beginners who had answered the call for their first time on a race track, after which they led them around the track where they had a chance to learn as they drove and how to pass safely.

For the less

adventurous, during lunchtime, the track was opened for a half-hour lead-and-follow session at nearly highway speed behind a licensed competition driver.

After a break for lunch, the remaining hours in the afternoon were filled with all classes of driving, and some exciting competition especially amongst the Mazda Miata's in race group.

The restaurant at the track is truly well done, offering hot and tasty food. The general store and photo shop has all sorts of souvenirs and is open all day.

It was truly an *experience* and a safe way to enjoy a truly prestigious car.

We return to the Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum



We had not visited the Antique Gas & Steam Engine Museum in Vista since the late aughts, so it was about time to return to this wonderful time-warp nestled in the San Diego County countryside.

And here we are, back at the beginning of the day - hanging in the parking lot, talking about cars.




