Competition Program Suspended

This past spring, your AROSC Board of Directors became aware of financial and organizational issues with the Time Trial / Race / High Performance Driver's Education part of our Club. Primary was lack of funds to pay the required deposits to Willow Springs Raceway to secure our September and October 2023 competition events. Secondary was a lack of personnel to stage these events.

The Board of Directors formed a Race Subcommittee to study the issues and determine a course of action. Historical data regarding participation and financial results from track events organized by AROSC yielded the following conclusions:

- 1) The club has lost money on most racetrack events operated over the past three years, depleting the competition treasury.
- 2) Actual participation by AROSC members is low, with less than 1/5th of the total revenue collected coming from our members, which jeopardizes its status as a non-profit 501-C-7 entity. The vast majority of participants in AROSC TT/HPDE events were not AROSC members.
- 3) There is no evidence that this fall's racetrack events would result in anything but the club losing many additional thousands of dollars.

As a result of the above conclusions, the Race Subcommittee recommended that the two upcoming fall 2023 racetrack events be cancelled. Further, it was recommended that AROSC cease n track events indefinitely, for the same financial reason. The AROSC Board of Directors have accepted these recommendations.

This chapter's 50+ year history of highly regarded racetrack events made this decision very difficult. That legacy was not lightly ended. We anticipate there will be members who are disappointed in this outcome. If the situation were to change, and an AROSC member wished to develop a business plan that includes a new source of funding and restarting AROSC-organized racetrack events that made financial sense, the Board is open to such proposals. 


