### In Search of




We had a fun day on May 5th enjoying some *great* driving roads (Oh, that Bouquet Canyon!), majestic scenery and lunch.

## Take Your Alfa to the Beach - Huntington Beach That Is!

Our second AROSC Club Concours will take place at the Huntington Beach Concours d'Elegance on Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>. This will be the 38<sup>th</sup> Huntington Beach Concours and will include a salute to the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Mustang, BMW cars and Yamaha motorcycles, as well as some great Alfas.



This event will be held on the picturesque lawns of Huntington Beach Central Park, adjacent to the Huntington Beach Public Library and Cultural Resource Center on Talbert Avenue between Goldenwest and Gothard Steets.

If you plan to exhibit your car, you must register by noon on Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup>. Early registration is recommended.

Registration costs \$55/car at <a href="https://www.hbconcours.org/register-vehicle/">https://www.hbconcours.org/register-vehicle/</a>. Driver and one passenger can ride into the event with each registered car. You can request that your Alfa not be judged, but you'll still need to register through the Concours website to park it on the field. If you don't register an Alfa, you can still join the fun; spectator entry is \$15 per person and parking is available at the adjacent Sports Complex.

The Huntington Beach Concours organizers have defined their Alfa Romeo classes in a way that doesn't fit our club's usual classes, but we can make it work with your help. So please select a class as defined below when you register your car:

06A Open: All open Alfas through 1995 06B Closed: All closed Alfas through 1995 06C Sedan: All Alfas 1996 and newer

Special Message for Daily Driver Entrants: For AROSC members with classic (pre-1996) Alfas who typically compete in the Daily Driver Class, please enter your vehicle in 06B or 06C above. 
